About 5 o'clock on the morning of the 12th inst. the brig Tagus, Simpson, from Port-Glasgow, for this port, went ashore in a snow storm on the Gull Rock, 5 leagues to the westward of Grand Menan. The vessel filled immediately with water, when as many of the crew as the pinnace would carry safely, took her, together with a small quantity of provisions, and with difficulty landed on the Great Seal Island, where they were shortly joined by the jolly boat, leaving four men still upon the wreck—the sea breaking so completely over the Gull Rock, that a landing there was impracticable. The pinnace with 5 men returning to the wreck for the remaining part of the crew, unfortunately got into a strong current, and drove to sea against every exertion, and have not since been heard of. The sufferings of the crew on the Seal Islands and wreck, from intense cold, is indescribable. On the 15th they were discovered, and taken off by a fishing vessel belonging to Machias, and landed at Little River; where the inhabitants humanely contributed to their wants and dressed their frozen limbs. Several fruitless attempts were made to get to the wreck until the 19th, when she had completely disappeared. On the 21st, hired a vessel to bring them to this port, where Captain S. and the remainder of his distressed crew arrived on Sunday last.

DIED] On Sunday morning last, aged 64 years, JOHN BOYD, Esquire, of the Medical Staff in this Province. In the exercise of his professional duties, he was assiduous and humane.—Governed universally in his conduct through life by the strictest principles of integrity, and endued with an amiable and affectionate disposition, he justly gained the esteem and love of all who knew him.
