At Fredericton, N. B. on the 9th February last, universally regretted, *JOHN JENKINS*, Esqr. late Captain 4th Royal Veteran Battalion, and Town Major of New Brunswick.

The most ardent zeal and activity in His Majesty's Service, have marked this young Officer's career through life, and particularly in Canada, during the late War with the United States, when as a Captain in the Glengary Light Infantry, his distinguished services called forth the admiration of his Country. His sufferings during the last six years of his life were unabated, having while leading his Company in the most gallant manner at the Battle of Ogdensburg lost one arm, and received a most severe wound in the other, the consequences of which were finally the cause of his death, at an age which with a sound and vigorous constitution might have justified a hope of his living to an advanced period of life. His virtues in private life are no less entitled to the eulogium of his Friends; uniting with the most strict integrity that urbanity of manners which distinguishes the character of the manly soldier, and which had endeared him to all who had the pleasure of his acquaintance. In his character were united the dutiful and affectionate Son, the tender husband and sincere Friend.—In him Society is deprived of one of its most valuable members, and the Service one of its brightest ornaments.
