

**NEW-YORK, JULY 22.**

Arrived, ship *Mary Augusta*, Bicker, 50 days from Greenock; June 23, lat. 45; fell in with the wreck of the ship *Juno*, of St. John, N. B. described.

**JULY 26.**

At Brig *Pedlar*, Vermilye, from Havre, via Plymouth, Eng. 48 days from the former; and 38 days from the latter; July 9, lat. 34, 20 long. 84, spoke brig *Sailor Boy*, 59 days from Philadelphia for Rio Janeiro. Same day was boarded by an armed schr. an armed ship in company under French colours, mounting 18 guns, full of blacks and mulattoes, who boarded in their boats, armed with long knives, swords, pistols, &c. and drove all hands into the fore-castle, with the captain. The pirates then commenced an indiscriminate plunder of every thing worth taking, clothing, &c. and took away a great part of the cargo—beat the officers, crew, &c.

The brig *Mary*, Gear, 32 days from Pernambuco; July 15, in lat. 28, 54 long. 63, 38, spoke brig *Lucretia*, 40 days from Halifax for Jamaica—supplied her with sugar, tea, rum, &c.

The brig *Harmony*, Brown, 9 days from St. Mary's; on the 14th inst. five sailors came to St. Mary's, in a large clinker boat—said they belonged to the brig *Ann*, Thomas Sanlay, master, of Scarborough, bound from Matanzas, to England, with a cargo of coffee and sugar—that she was lost on Florida Reef the 29th of June—that the officers, captain, mate, carpenter and cook, were lost in attempting to get a hove in the boat. Those saved, as they said, were Wm. Smith, boatswain, John Furlong, Jas. Carland, John Vanson, and Thomas Newton.

*Bristol*, July 22.—Arrived, brig *Seconda*, Hall, 40 days from Boston for N. Orleans—July 1, lat. 25, long. 80, was boarded by a large boat, with two lateen sails and jib, mounting one small gun, with men of all nations. They took what stores they wanted, and told us to proceed.

The schr. *Montezuma*, of Baltimore, is captured by Lord Cochrane's squadron, off Lima.

**JULY 31.**

From Spain—Ship *Hornet* arrived.—The United States ship *Hornet*, captain Reed, which vessel carried out Mr. Forsyth, the American Minister to Spain, returned to this port yesterday afternoon from Cadiz. The *Hornet* left Cadiz on the 2d of July, at which time the treaty ceding the Floridas to the United States, had not been ratified by the Spanish government. Captain Reed has brought despatches for the Secretary of State.

The Spanish expedition destined for S. America, was expected to be ready to sail on the last of July or beginning of August. The government had procured transports sufficient to convey 20,000 men, which were in readiness, waiting only for the equipment of a few men of war that were repairing in dock.

The Marquis de Casa Yrujo and family were seized at their dwelling, and sent to prison on the 28th of June. There was a rumor that they had been assassinated. It was reported that Gen. O'Donnell, the Governor of Cadiz had received an order to put to death the crew of the Patriot Privateer Constitution, stranded near Gibraltar—a great number of the crew were Americans. The Governor is said to have remonstrated against the order. A part of the expedition fitting out in Spain, it was stated was for the defence of the Floridas.

It was the general opinion at Cadiz that Spain would not ratify the Treaty with this country.

The Officers and Crew of the Patriot Privateer Constitution, taken some time since near Gibraltar (after being on shore) are in Cadiz in Dungeons. Gen. O'Donnell (Gov. of Cadiz) had received an order from the King, granting a pardon to all Spanish Subjects found on board that vessel, and a command to execute all the foreigners; he, however, remonstrated against this barbarity. The result of his refusal we do not know—70 Americans are among the Prisoners.

As it is the intention of the Society to assist emigrant settlers in general, those persons who think Agriculture deserving of public patronage, have now an opportunity of contributing to the establishment of a number of families on new lands, whose sole business must be Husbandry, and who may pave the way to a chain of settlements, as there is a large tract of unappropriated land adjoining, of an excellent quality.

*New-York*, August 7.—Gold and Silver.—It is not generally known, that after the first of November next, agreeable to a law passed the last Session of Congress, no foreign Gold Coin will be a legal tender. The effect of this knowledge will be, to throw into our banks most of the gold coin now in the United States, which will be transmitted to the United States Mint and be made into Eagles.

It ought also to be recollected, that at the end of two years from the first of April last, all foreign Silver Coin, except Spanish Dollars and parts thereof, ceases to be a legal tender in the United States.
