The subscriptions that have already been obtained in this Town for the Welch settlers, will enable them to finish their houses and procure food for a few weeks; but as they are very destitute, and have large families of helpless children, it is evident without farther assistance they must nearly perish with cold and hunger the ensuing winter. It will appear by the subscription lists that a part of the inhabitants have contributed very liberally for their relief; and there can be no doubt but the other part feel for their destitute situation, and would be very sorry to hear of families famishing for want of food while they are enjoying abundance—such should consider that empty wishes clothe not the naked, nor fill the hungry. "If a brother or sister," says St. James, "be naked and destitute of daily food, and one of you say unto them depart in peace, be ye warmed and filled, notwithstanding ye give them not those things which are needful to the body, what doth it profit them."

Montreal, September 1.

We have this day the painful task of announcing to our readers the unexpected death of our Governor in Chief the DUKE OF RICHMOND—He died on Saturday last, the 28th ultimo, at 8 o'clock of the morning, after a few hours illness, as he was returning from his tour to Upper Canada, by the way of the new settlements and the Ottawa river.—Yesterday morning at an early hour the body was brought to the Government House in this City, and about 7 o'clock of the evening was carried on board the steam boat Malham, to be conveyed to Quebec. On this solemn occasion, the troops in garrison, with music, the officers of the different departments, the clergy and citizens of every degree, attended his Grace's remains to the river side.

Distressing Casualty!—On Sunday last, Mr. GEORGE LEAVITT, of this City, accompanied his brother, (one of the branch pilots for this port) to Manawagonish Island, a few miles from the harbour.—On their arrival there they ascended a cliff of rocks which serves as a look-out place for vessels coming from sea. Mr. L. having descried a sail in the offing, informed his brother thereof, and proceeded to descend the cliff to the boat, in doing which, his foot slipped, and he was precipitated about 40 feet to the rocky rocks below, putting at once an immediate period to his existence, his skull being fractured and his body much bruised. He was taken up and brought to town the same day—and yesterday interred from the house of Messrs. LEAVITTS his brothers, attended by a great number of sympathising relatives and acquaintance, who sincerely lament his premature death.—Mr. L. was in the 21st year of his age.—City Gazette.
