We have no official communication as yet, of the appointment, which report says has lately been made in England, of a Surveyor-General of Lands; but we copy the following from the (St. John) City Gazette of the 30th ultimo.---

"We are enabled to announce that the office of Surveyor General of this Province is at length filled by the appointment of ANTHONY LOCKWOOD, Esq. to that situation."

We find a Mr. Lockwood named in the list of Passengers lately arrived in the Thornley, at Halifax, and we suppose that gentleman to be the person above alluded to.

There is a report generally circulating in Town this morning, that Colonel the Hon. Sir Robert Le Poer Trench is to administer the Government of the Province in the expected absence of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, to England. We cannot say much for the correctness of this report—it may possibly be true.

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor took his departure from this place yesterday morning in the Steam-Boat for the City.

The Sequestered Village and Patriotic City.

Mr. Lugin,

It may not be amiss now to enquire into the meaning of terms *Patriotic City* and *Sequestered Village*. If the word *Patriotic* is to be understood in the same sense that it would be in the term *Patriotic Kingdom*, there can be no doubt of its correctness. That the City is "actuated by the care of itself," must be very certain—So would a *Patriotic Kingdom* be. But suppose the *Freeholder* intended to mean that the *Inhabitants* of the City were *Patriots*, and extended their benevolence beyond its walls, I see no objection to the word as thus intended to convey a meaning. I know enough of the Citizens to be able to bear ample testimony to the *Loyalty* as well as *Patriotism* of its Inhabitants.—In proportion to their numbers they need not, in that respect, yield the palm to any other part of the Province—but the term *Patriotic* must be understood to be used, in this instance, relatively. The *Freeholder* means to say (if he means any thing) that the Citizens are *pre-eminently* patriotic—and in that I differ from him entirely. The inhabitants of every other part of the Province are equally patriotic with the Citizens of Saint John, and are far more numerous. The *Freeholder* is equally unfortunate in the use of the term *Sequestered Village*. What has sequestered the Town of Fredericton from the other parts of the Province?—It is for him to answer the question. If he means to say that its situation is *remote*, I deny the assertion. It is farther from the City than the City is from itself, I will admit: but, as connected with the Province, it is in a central situation; it is easy of access to every other part of the Province; and the most eligible spot, in every respect, for the *Metropolis* or *Seat of Government*. I will, for the information of those who may not be so well acquainted with it as the *Freeholder* is, at a future day attempt a description of the *Village* of Fredericton—at present I will not trespass longer on the time of your readers.

PROVINCE OF LOWER-CANADA. RICHMOND, LENNOX & AUBIGNY.

GEORGE THE THIRD, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, and so forth.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, or may in any wise concern;—

GREETING.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS in and by an Act of the Provincial Parliament of Lower-Canada, passed in the last Session, in the present year of our Reign, intituled "An Act to secure the Inhabitants of the Inferior District of Gaspé, in the possession and enjoyment of their Lands;" it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful to and for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or the person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, at any time during the space of three years from the passing of the said Act, to issue such and so many Commissions, under the Great Seal of the said Province, as he shall think proper, to nominate three or more persons to be Commissioners, one of whom shall be President of each of the said Commissions; which said Commissioners shall have power and authority to hear and determine all applications that shall or may be made to them, by persons holding or claiming to hold Lands as aforesaid, for Grants thereof under the Great Seal of the Province in the like manner as the same might be heard and determined by the Executive Council of the said Province.

And Whereas by letters patent, under the Great Seal of our said Province, bearing date at our Castle of Saint Lewis, in our City of Quebec, the twenty-seventh day of April, in the present year of our reign,

we have nominated, constituted and appointed, JEAN THOMAS TASCHEREAU, MICHEL LOUIS JUCHEREAU DUCHESNAY, and GEORGE WATERS ALLSOPP, Esquires, to be Commissioners, to hear and determine all applications that shall or may be made to them, by persons holding or claiming to hold Lands as aforesaid, for Grants thereof, under the Great Seal of our said Province.

Now therefore know ye, that we do hereby notify and require all persons holding, or claiming to hold, Lands in the said Inferior District of Gaspé, to present their claims thereto before the said Commissioners, at Douglass Town, Percé, New Carlisle, Bonaventure, New Richmond, Carleton, and Ristigouche, from this date to the first September next, and at Quebec at any period within fifteen months next after the date of these presents, to the end that such claims may be heard and determined, and that Grants under the Great Seal of our said Province may be made.

In Testimony whereof, these our Letters we have caused to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of our said Province to be thereunto affixed.

Witness our Trusty and well beloved His Grace CHARLES, DUKE OF RICHMOND, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Captain General and Governor in Chief of our said Province of Lower-Canada, &c. &c. at our Castle of Saint Lewis, in our City of Quebec, in our said Province, the twenty-ninth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, and in the fifty-ninth year of our Reign.
