**LEGISLATURE OF NEW-BRUNSWICK.**  
[EXTRACTS FROM THE JOURNALS]  
6th March.

Mr. Pagan, from the Committee of Supply, reported, that the Committee had gone into consideration of the business to them referred, and had come to sundry resolutions—which, being read, were as follow:—

**County of York.**

The sum of £200 towards completing the Road from the mouth of the Nashwalk River to the mouth of the Keswick Creek, commencing where the improvements left off in 1816.

The sum of £25 to cut out a new Road from John M'Keen's, on the Macdequack Stream, to the New Settlement in the rear thereof.

The sum of £50 towards completing the Road and Bridges from George Jones' to Jacob Ellegood's.

The sum of £50 towards completing the Road from Jacob Ellegood's to Adam Allan's, on the Poquioch.

The sum of £40 towards completing the Road from the Great Road, in Woodstock, to the Richmond Settlement.

The sum of £30 towards completing the Road, in Woodstock, to the Jackson Settlement.

The sum of £50 towards completing the Road from Joseph Wolverton's (Northampton) to Robert Phillips'.

The sum of £65 towards completing the Road from Robert Phillips' to Lawrence Wolsey's.

**County of Sunbury.**

**General Jackson Acquitted.**

**Congress.**—In the House of Representatives on the 8th inst. Mr. Clay took the floor at an early hour, and closed his remarks on the Seminole War, which has so long occupied the attention of the House. He was answered by Messrs. Floyd, and Irvine; when the question was taken, on the resolution reported by the Committee on Military Affairs, disapproving the proceedings in the trial and execution of Arbuthnot and Ambrister, and decided in the negative, by a separate vote viz. on that, respecting Arbuthnot, the majority was 108 to 62; on that respecting Ambrister, the majority was 107 to 63.—This variance was produced by Mr. Gage, of Mass. who was in the minority on the Military Committee, but who voted against Jackson's conduct in regard to Ambrister. The resolution of Mr. Cobb, declaring the seizure of Pensacola and Barancas, contrary to the constitution of the U. States, was negatived by 100 to 70 votes. Thus is settled a question that has occupied the attention of Congress for three weeks, and produced a more interesting and parliamentary discussion, than we believe, any other topic, ever before agitated in the National Assembly. 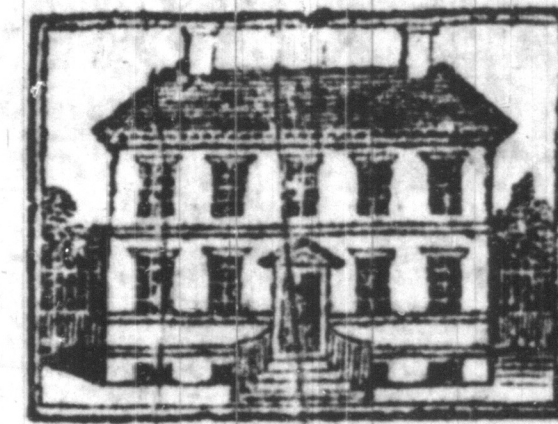
