Population in Greenland.—According  
to the accounts received by the Missionary  
College, at Copenhagen, the whole popula-  
tion of Greenland, as far as it is known, in  
the 17 Danish colonies, West Coast, a-  
mounts to 5836. The coasts alone are in-  
habited; the interior of the country being  
covered with eternal ice. The population  
has increased since 1789 by 714 souls.  
The number here given is according to the  
enumeration made in 1816.

A letter from Petersburg, dated January  
14, says, "The Gulph of Finland is as  
open to navigation as in the middle of sum-  
mer, a circumstance never before known at  
this period. There is not a single flake of  
ice in the roads of Narva."

A young French traveller, nephew of  
Count Mollieu, Ex-Minister, has succeeded  
in reaching Tombuctoo by way of Senegal.  
His family has just received a letter from  
him, in which he announces his safe arrival  
in that celebrated town hitherto unknown to  
Europeans, and which the unfortunate  
Mungo Park twice vainly attempted to  
reach.

Discovery of an Ancient City.—A  
French traveller now in Egypt has discover-  
ed, at the distance of about nine hours' jour-  
ney from the Red Sea, an ancient city built  
in the mountains, between the 24th and  
25th degree of latitude. There are still  
200 houses in existence. Among the ruins  
are found temples dedicated to various di-  
vinites. There are eleven statues, and  
various ruins of others. He has also dis-  
covered the ancient stations that were appoint-  
ed on the route through the Desert going  
from the Red Sea to the Valley of the Nile.  
These stations are at regular distances of nine  
hours between each. This route is undoubt-  
edly one of those traversed by the commerce  
of India,—a commerce which was so flour-  
ishing at the time of the Lagides, and under  
the first Emperors. The situation is now  
ascertained of the emerald mine, of which  
no certain knowledge was had for several  
ages.
