A Message from the Council, by Mr. Black, as follows:—

"Mr. Speaker,

"The Council have agreed to the resolution of appropriation sent up by the Assembly, dated this day, for the contingent expenses of the present Session."

A Bill "to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue for the services therein mentioned."—was read as engrossed and sent to the Council for their concurrence.

A Message from the Council, by Mr. Robinson, as follows:—

"Mr. Speaker,

"The Council have concurred in passing a Bill "to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue for the services therein mentioned."

The House took into consideration the Message communicated by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor this day.

On which, Mr. Humbert moved, that it be resolved as the opinion of this House, that the system adopted by His Majesty's Government in this Province for the payment of one shilling per ton on Pine Timber, is not necessarily within the consideration of the House of Assembly, and that any resolve of this House on the said system may be deemed an improper interference with His Majesty's Prerogative:

"Whereupon resolved, after mature deliberation had, that in consequence of the Message from His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, on the subject of the resolve of the 17th of March, relative to the proceedings of His Majesty's Government, in the disposal of Pine Timber in this Province, that the said resolve be not retained on the Journals of this House."

Upon which the House divided as follows:—

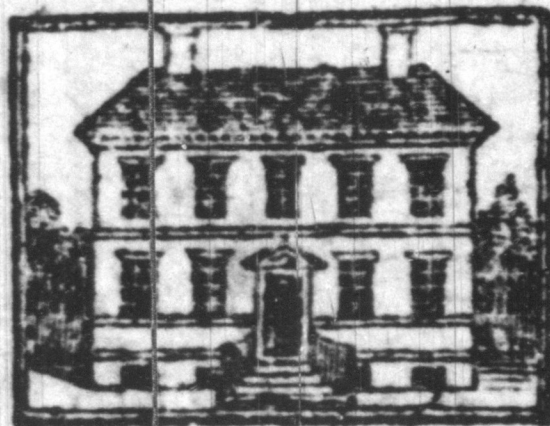

SPANISH TREATY.

The Treaty with Spain, was yesterday, unanimously ratified by the Senate.

No copy is to be published, until ratified by both governments. Its contents, however, are known.

For the Floridas, the United States are to pay our merchants, a sum not exceeding five million dollars. The claims to be adjusted and paid—viz.—

1st. Those under the Convention of 1802.

2. French spoiliations, in Spanish ports.

3. For damage on account of the suspension of the right of deposit at New-Orleans.

4. Spanish captures, at sea, or in the ports of the Spanish Colonies, since 1802.

5. Other claims, from 1802 to the date of the Treaty, which have been exhibited to the Secretary of State, or to the American minister at Madrid, and in which the interposition of the American government is requested.

The claims to be adjusted and settled by three Commissioners, appointed by the President and Senate, and the sums allowed, to be paid either in money, or in stock, at 6 per cent. payable out of the sales of Florida Lands.

All grants made by Spain, in the ceded territory, anterior to the 1st day of January 1812, are to be respected.

The Islands adjacent to Florida, are ceded with the territory.

It is stipulated that the territory shall be admitted into the union on an equal footing with the original States.

NEW-YORK, MARCH 8.

The Congress of the United States closed its session on the evening of the 3d inst. The two Houses adjourned sine die about half past 9 o'clock.
