

Minden Sahib and suite, sent by the Nabob of Bednor, (Hind.) to the Court of England, has arrived at Ramsgate. He came to Egypt by way of the Red Sea, and is accompanied by Dr. Ramsay.

JANUARY 14.

The following extract of a letter, dated Malta, December 15, 1818, contains very alarming intelligence of the ravages of the plague at Tunis:—

"By the arrival of the Neapolitan brig the San Michele l'Archangel, we learn, that at the time of her departure from Tunis, the plague carried off from 2 to 300 persons a day. In consequence of this, the vessel was ordered to depart from our port, and she has accordingly sailed. The report of the death of our Consul, was erroneous."

Since the commencement of the present year, there has been consumed in lighting the streets of London, each night, 300,000 cubic feet of Gas; for the manufacture of which more than 100,000 lbs. of coal were required. This quantity of Gas furnished 76,500 argand lamps, the light of one of which was equal to a pound of candles of six to the pound. The pipes for conducting this Gas, embraced an extent of 40 English miles— one reservoir, called a Gasometer, received 27,000 cubic feet.

PARIS, DECEMBER 23.

It is said the Duke of Richelieu is suffering under an indisposition which confines him to his apartment.

A Persian Envoy arrived at Constantinople in November, with horses and rich clothes as presents to the Grand Seignior, the Emperor of Austria, King of France, and Prince Regent of England.

JANUARY 7.

The expedition for China is now at anchor in the road of the island of Aix; it is composed of the King's ships Rhone, and the Durance, and is on the point of sailing.

That for Senegal, composed of the ships the Tarre, the Charente, the Nantaise, the Bretonne, the Prudence, the Isere, are in the same road. Some arrangements remain to be made before their departure, which will probably be before the 15th January. The passengers have embarked, and they are using all diligence to take advantage of the favorable winds, which have prevailed for some time.

JANUARY 11.

The new English expedition to explore the interior of Africa, is under the command of M. Ritchie, recently private Secretary of the English Ambassador at Paris—his associates are Lieutenant Lyon, of the English ship Albion, M. Dupoute, French naturalist, a surgeon, and a carpenter. The Bashaw and a military escort are to accompany them from Tripoli, where they now are, as far as Mourzook—they ought to have a similar protection during the whole of their journey.

NEW-YORK, MARCH 17.

Murder of Fualdes.—The renewed trial of persons implicated in the horrid murder of M. Fualdes, nearly two years since, attracts much attention at Albany.—The famous Madame Manson is a witness, and she has deposed pre-emptorily, that one of the accused was of the murderers who surrounded the table when the throat of M. F. was cut.

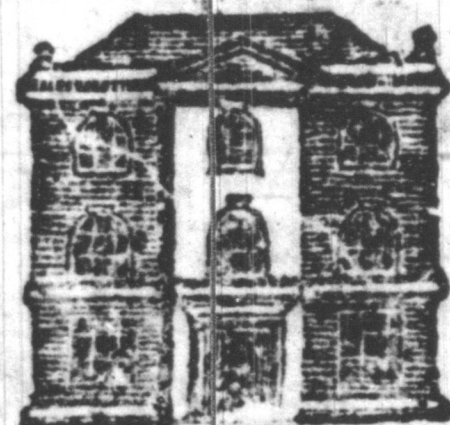

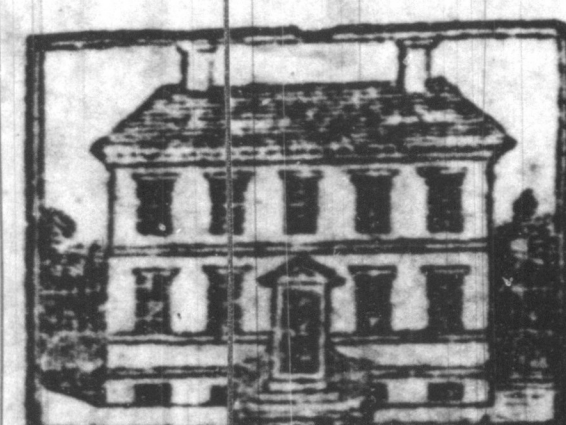
