From the E. P. Sentinel, 10th June.

We learn from capt. Minott, from Boston, that a brig ballasted with bricks, 70 days from England, anchored at Petit menan, in the fog, on Friday last, and sent her boat ashore with the mate and 3 men to ascertain where they were, which has not since been heard of. The brig passed here last Sunday for St. Andrews, having lost one of her anchors when she got under way.

Bulletin of the King's Health.—The following is the Bulletin of his Majesty's Health, which it is stated was delayed by accident:—

Windsor Castle, June 5

“His Majesty has passed the last month very quietly, though still exhibiting the same continued marks of disorder. His Majesty's general health is unimpaired.”

Letters have been received in town from Berlin, stating that the Duchess of Cumberland and the young Prince were going on extremely well.

A respectable house in the German line stopped payment on Tuesday morning. Its connexions are chiefly with Hamburg and Amsterdam.

Her Royal Highness the Duchess of Cumberland was safely delivered of a male child in the afternoon of the 27th May last.

“The following Address, having been transmitted to the Earl-Bathurst, one of His Majesty's principal Secretaries of State, has been presented by His Lordship to His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT, who was pleased to receive the same very graciously.”

To His Royal Highness George Prince of Wales, REGENT of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland &c. &c.

The joint and humble Address of the Council and House of Assembly of the Province of New Brunswick, in General Assembly convened.

May it please your Royal Highness.

THE Council and House of Assembly of His Majesty's loyal and affectionate Province of New Brunswick, penetrated with the deepest sense of the loss which has been sustained in every part of His Majesty's extended dominions, by the death of the august Parent of your Royal Highness, our late Most Gracious Queen, beg leave most humbly and respectfully to lay at the feet of your Royal Highness the sincere expressions of their profound grief upon this most sorrowful occasion.

Selected at an early period of her life by our most venerable and beloved Sovereign to participate in the splendour of his Throne, and in the glories of his reign, Her Majesty at once evinced to the nation and to the world the wisdom of his choice, and by an example most eminently conspicuous for the display of all those qualities that endear and adorn the female character in public or private life, continued through a long and an invaluable reign, to reflect back upon her exalted situation, an ample portion of that renown which had been derived to her from her elevation to the Throne.

In addition to all the sources of affliction and regret with which this calamitous event has filled the minds of all His Majesty's faithful subjects, your Royal Highness must feel the poignant sensations of filial sorrow, which on this occasion excite the sincere sympathy and unaffected condolence of the Council and Assembly, who now beg leave most respectfully to solicit indulgence for their participation in the hallowed grief of your Royal Highness.

In the discharge of this mournful duty, it is a high source of consolation to the Council and Assembly to reflect that Her Majesty was so late called to the enjoyment of the rewards of a well spent life, that the united example and virtues which have distinguished the British diadem since the accession of the august Parents of your Royal Highness to the Throne of these realms, have stamped the moral character of the age in which we live; and there is so much reason to hope for a permanent continuance of the salutary influence of those blessings under the benign auspices of the Government of your Royal Highness.
