

BOSTON, APRIL 28.

By the arrival of the rapid-sailing ship Triton, Captain Holcomb, from Liverpool, since our last publication, London papers to the 1st of April, and Liverpool to the 23, have been received.

It would appear by some brief remarks that have been made in the British Parliament, that an objection is entertained to some part of our treaty with England—or that the period of submitting a bill respecting it, is to be taken for entering into an investigation of the justice of the execution of two British subjects (Auburn and Ambriester) during our Seminole war. The Ministers appear inclined to defer this discussion. Perhaps they hope for the arrival of Mr. Bagot, before this subject should be introduced; or they may wish first to see the decision of the American Senate on the last report.

Commercial difficulties still continue in Europe, and the price of merchandize is much depressed.

A late London paper states, that no less than 500 persons in the parish of Portsea, are about to emigrate to the United States.

The London papers mention the arrival of Lord Cochrane at Valparaiso—that an expedition was preparing against Lima—and he was to command.

Captain Wright, late of H. B. M. brig Griffin, has been tried in England on a charge of smuggling, found guilty, and sentenced to be dismissed the service.

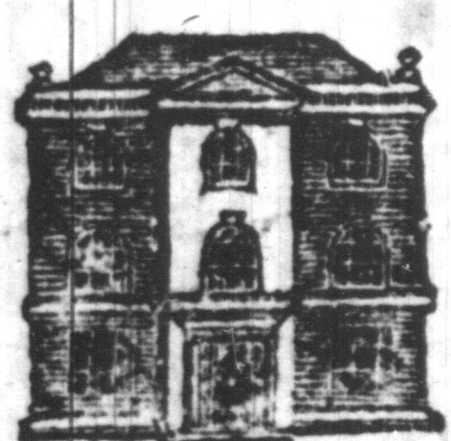

Extract of a Letter from a Gentleman in Miramichi, to his Friend in Fredericton, dated 7th May, 1819:—

“The Spring ships are beginning to make their appearance, but have brought no news of any importance. Four vessels were cast on shore at the entrance of this Harbour, on the 28th April last, and will in all probability be totally lost. The hulls of two of them, (the Snow Sarah, of London, and the William & Ann, of Shields) have been sold and bought, the one £12 and the other £9 only. I am informed that they are now dismantling the brig Ann, Wm. Richards, master, from Liverpool, there being no hopes of getting her off. The brig Caledonia, D. Miller, is also on shore, and injured, but whether irreparable I am not informed. All these disasters are to be imputed to the imprudence of those who had charge of the vessels, in bringing them into the entrance before the River or Bay ice had gone out: the two that were caught between the floating and fast ice, were literally crushed to pieces.”

The House of Assembly has unanimously requested the Attorney-General to file two criminal prosecutions against Mr. Michael Ryan, Printer and Publisher of *The Globe*, Newspaper; one for a Libel on the House, and the other for a Libel on the Colonial Government, in charging it with Tyranny and Oppression in calling out the Militia on Friday last, and endeavouring to excite Sedition in the Regiment.
