Proclamation

By His Excellency Major-General GEORGE STRACEY SMYTH, Lieutenant-Governor and Commander in Chief of the Province of New-Brunswick, &c. &c. &c.

THEREAS, in consequence of the Demise of His late Most Sacred Majesty, King George the Third, I have thought fit to DISSOLVE the GENE-RAL ASSEMBLY of this Prove, which now stands prorogued to Tuesday the 6th day of June next-

An Act further to alter and amend an Act Great Roads of communication through the Province."

Passed the 29th of March 1820. THEREAS the Road leading from Fredericton to Northumberland as established in and by An Act made and passed in the fifty-sixth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled " An Act for the establishment of the Great Roads of communication throughout the Province," is to cross at the Forks of the River Miramichi to Babcock's, and to continue on that side of the said River to Indian Town, and then to recross the same River; which part of the said Road having been found to be very inconvenient,

1. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council, and Assembly, that the said Road shall not in future cross the Great Roads as established by the said and recross the said River, as aforesaid, but be continued on the Western side of the River to Indian Town, and be laid out in such manner as the Supervisor or Supervisors shall think fit.

Chief for the time being, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Council, is hereby authorized and empowered to appoint, by warrant under his Hand and Seal, two fit and discreet persons to be Supervisors of the Great Roads throughout the Province; which persons, when so appointed, shall give security in the sum of three thousand Pounds Given under my Hand and Seal, each, and be sworn to the faithful discharge at Fredericton, the fifteenth day of their duty respectively, and be vested of May, in the year of our Lord with all the powers and authority which the one thousand eight hundred and former Supervisors possessed, and be subject to all the restrictions, provisions and limitations of the same Act, and of the Acts made in addition to and in amendment thereof, except where they are in and by this Act altered.

> V. And be it further enacted, that each of the said Supervisors shall be allowed to retain for his services, at and after the rate of ten per cent. for every hundred Pounds that shall be expended by him out of the monies granted for the use of the said Roads. An Act to provide for and encourage the settlement of Emigrants in this Province.

Passed the 29th March 1820. THEREAS it is deemed expedient for the Interest of the Province, to facilitate the settlement of industrious and enterprising Emigrants from the

I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council, and Assembly, that the Lieutenant-Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Council, is hereby authorized and empowered to appoint a number of discreet persons, not exceeding three in each of the Counties of this Province; which persons when so appointed, shall serve as a Committee in their respective Counties, whose duty it shall be to enquire into the Characters, Testimonials and claims of all such Emigrants as may arrive at or come into their respective Counties from the Mother Country, with an intention of becoming Settlers therein; and shall also enquire into the probable means that such Emigrants possess of becoming useful settlers in the Province; and in all cases where such investigation shall prove satisfactory, the Committee making such en quiry, shall report, and recommend such Emigrants to His Excellency the Lieuten ant-Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being, for Location Tickets for the Lots to be Surveyed and laid out in the several Counties, as is hereafter mentioned.

II. And be it further enacted, that for the accommodation of Poor Emigrants, such a number of Lots, and to contain so many acres each, as His Excellency the Lieuten ant-Governor or Commander in Chief, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Coun cil, may be pleased to limit and direct, shall be laid out and Surveyed in the several Counties of this Province, and in such parts of said Counties as His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being, by and with the advice aforesaid, shall think expedient.

Regulations for granting Licences to cut Pine Timber Vacant Crown on, the Lands.

Fredericton, 14th April 1820. Every Petition for Licence to cut Pine Timber must contain the following particulars, supported either by the affidavit of the Party or a Certificate from a Magistrate,

That the Petitioner is a British Subject, Freeholder, and not connected, directly or indirectly, in the transaction, with an Alien.

The Certificate of the Surveyor-General must also be obtained, that the district applied for is vacant Crown Land, and that there is no prior application to settle on the same.

The Petition is then to be lodged at the Secretary's Office, to be submitted to the Lieutenant-Governor.

The Licence, if granted, will be given to an officer of the Surveyor-General's Department or to one of the Deputies of the Surveyor General of the Woods, as his auhority for inspecting and marking out the Districe therein described at the expence of he Petitioner. Previous to which a Bond nust be entered into to His Majesty, at the Secretary's Office, at the rate of one shilling per Ton for the quantity of Timber mentioned in the Licence, and the established Fees of Office then paid in part of the sum specified in the condition of the Bond.

The officers in the Surveyor General's Department and those in the Department of the Surveyor-General of the Woods, are hereby strictly charged against marking out any District without the previous authority of a Licence granted as aforesaid, or a special warrant under the Hand and Seal of the Lieutenant-Governors and every Per-
