Monday, 6th March.

A Bill, " to auch rize and impower the Tustices of the Peace for the County of York, in their General Sessions assembled, to levy an assessment on the Inhabitants of the different Parishes in the said County, for erecting a County Poor-House in the Parish of Fredericton." -- were read a second time, and ordered to be committed on Wednesday next of the said

The House went into further hearing of the parties upon the Petition of Amos Perley and sundey Electors of the County of Sunbury, complaining of an undue Election,

Tuesday, 7th March. Read as engrossed, a Bill, " to confirm certain conveyances made by the Governor

wick,"-passed and sent to the Council for their concurrence.

Mr. Fraser presented a Petition of sundry Inhabitants of the Parishes of Woodstock and Wakefield, praying aid to enable them to erect a bridge across the stream called Madishnahick.

Mr. Millidge presented a Petition of R hert Ferguson, praying that the sum of £85: 15 may be granted him, to remunerate him for his expenses and services as one of the Commissioners for opening that part of the road leading from Nepisiguit to Restigouch.

Mr. Wetmore presented a Petition of the Rev. E. Scovil and Walter Bates, Esq. praying that the sum of £60 granted last Session for aid towards the erecting of a commodious building for the accommodation of a School, upon the Madras System at Kingston, in the County of King's, may be appropriated for the benefit of the Institutien, and also that an annual sum of £60 may be granted them for the support of said School.

The above petition being read, were received and referred to the Committee of

Supply.

Mr. Fraser presented a Petition of a number of Inhabitants of the Province of New-Brunswick. praying that a duty may be imposed on foreign Lumber imported into this Province .-- which was ordered to ie on the table.

Resolved, That this House have seen with regret and surprise, the resolutions of the Council, as reported by the Committee appointed by this House to search the journals of the Council, as to their proceedings upon the Bill " to provide payment for certain public services," and which appear to express the reasons for the postponement of the further consideration of the Bill for six months :

That this House conceive that they are the ole judges of their own rights, in the appropriation of money for the public service:

That in making the provision for the payment of the Members of the present House of Assembly at twenty shillings per day each, the House did conceive that the principles of the Bill were in conformity to the proceedings of the Legislature in the year
