

Monday, 6th March.

A Bill, "to authorize and empower the Justices of the Peace for the County of York, in their General Sessions assembled, to levy an assessment on the Inhabitants of the different Parishes in the said County, for erecting a County Poor-House in the Parish of Fredericton."—were read a second time, and ordered to be committed on Wednesday next.

The House went into further hearing of the parties upon the Petition of Amos Perley and sundry Electors of the County of Sunbury, complaining of an undue Election, and false return.

Tuesday, 7th March.

Read as engrossed, a Bill, "to confirm certain conveyances made by the Governor and Trustees of the College of New-Brunswick,"—passed and sent to the Council for their concurrence.

Mr. Fraser presented a Petition of sundry Inhabitants of the Parishes of Woodstock and Wakefield, praying aid to enable them to erect a bridge across the stream called Madishnahick.

Mr. Millidge presented a Petition of Robert Ferguson, praying that the sum of £65 : 15 may be granted him, to remunerate him for his expenses and services as one of the Commissioners for opening that part of the road leading from Nepisiguit to Restigouche.

Mr. Wetmore presented a Petition of the Rev. E. Scovil and Walter Bates, Esq. praying that the sum of £60 granted last Session for aid towards the erecting of a commodious building for the accommodation of a School, upon the Madras System at Kingston, in the County of King's, may be appropriated for the benefit of the Institution, and also that an annual sum of £60 may be granted them for the support of said School.

The above petition being read, were received and referred to the Committee of Supply.

Mr. Fraser presented a Petition of a number of Inhabitants of the Province of New-Brunswick, praying that a duty may be imposed on foreign Lumber imported into this Province,—which was ordered to lie on the table.

Resolved, That this House have seen with regret and surprise, the resolutions of the Council, as reported by the Committee appointed by this House to search the journals of the Council, as to their proceedings upon the Bill "to provide payment for certain public services," and which appear to express the reasons for the postponement of the further consideration of the Bill for six months :

That this House conceive that they are the sole judges of their own rights, in the appropriation of money for the public service :

That in making the provision for the payment of the Members of the present House of Assembly at twenty shillings per day each, the House did conceive that the principles of the Bill were in conformity to the proceedings of the Legislature in the year 1818 :

That this House therefore see no just reason why a grant to defray the expenses of Members of this House during their attendance in General Assembly, should be deemed lavish and improvident, when a similar one met with the concurrence and approbation of the Council in the year 1818 :

On motion of Mr. Allen, That the order of the House for the exchange of lists of objectionable votes on the Sunbury scrutiny, having been misunderstood—

Ordered that the sitting Member be allowed to amend his list by adding thereto the names of Azor Smith and Israel Kenne.

The previous question being moved by Mr. Agnew, and seconded, the House resolved thereon, as follows :

For the question, 8,—Against it, 13. motion therefore passed in the negative.

The original motion being then put, the House divided thereon, as follows :

For the motion, 13.—Against it 8. motion therefore passed in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Allen, That the names of John Wood and Lionel Sealey be added to the list of objectionable votes given into the House by the petitioning Candidate, to be stricken.—The House divided, as fol-

For the motion, 7,—Against it, 14. It therefore passed in the negative.

The House went into further hearing of the parties upon the Petition of Amos Perley and sundry Electors of the County of Sunbury, complaining of an undue Election, and false return.

Ordered, that the order of the day for the commitment of the Bill, "to regulate the rates at which Gold and Silver Coin shall pass current in this Province," be discharged. Ordered that the Bill be committed to-morrow.
