[Extracts from the Journal.]

Monday, 20th March - (continued.)

To Warren Hatheway, the sum of £22: 10, being amount of drawback on five puncheons rum, containing 600 gallons exported in the American schooner Miller Anthony Brooks master, in the year 1817.

To William M'Donald, the sum of £29: 11, being amount of a bond given by him for the transient duty on sundry articles imported into this Province, in 1819.

To Wm. Abrams, the sum of £86: 6 to relieve him from a transient duty demand. ed by the Deputy-Treasurer at Miramichi.

To Hugh Johnston & Co. the sum of £138: 9: 3, being a drawback on 300 puncheons rum, containing 33131 galls. exported to Quebec in the year 1819.
