Whereof all persons whom it may concern, will take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.

> An Act to provide for and encourage the settlement of Emigrants in this Province.

> Passed the 29th March 1820. THEREAS it is deemed expedient for the Interest of the Province, to facilitate the settlement of industrious and enterprising Emigrants from the Mother Country,

I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council, and Assembly, that the Lieutenant-Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being, by and VI. And be it further enacted, that in with the advice of His Majesty's Council,

in such case the Lieutenant-Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being, by and with the advice of His Majesty Council, is hereby empowered to order and direct a Road or Roads to be laid out for the accommodation of such settlement ot settlements, under the direction of the Committee of the County in which such settlement or settlements shall be made.

V. And be it further enacted, that in order to defray the expenses of laying out and Sur eying the said Lots in the said everal and respective Counties of this Province, and for laying out and making Roads for the accommodation of the settlers in the same, there shall be allowed to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being, the sum of eight hundred Pounds, to be paid out of the Province Treasury, and to be by him expended and laid out, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Council, for the purposes herein before mentioned.
