Passed the 29th March 1820 THEREAS it is deemed expedi ent for the Interest of the Pr. ince, to facilitate the settlement of industrious and enterprising Emigrants from the Mother Country,

I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieuthat the Lieutenant-Governor or Comman der in Chief for the time being, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Council. is hereby authorized and empowered to appoint a number of discreet persons, not exceeding three in each of the Counties of this Province, which persons when so appointed, shall serve as a Committee in their respective Counties, whose duty it shall be to enquire into the Characters, Testimonials and claims of all such Emigrants as ma arrive at or come into their respective Counties from the Mother Country, with an intention of becoming Settlers therein ; and shall also enquire into the probable mean that such Emigrants possess of becoming use ful settlers in the Province; and in all cases where such investigation shall prove satifactory, the Committee making such en quiry, shall report, and recommend such Emigrants to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being, for Location Tickets for the Lots to be Surveyed and laid out in the several Counties, as is hereafter mentioned.

An Act further to alter and amend. an Act intituled " An Act for the establishment, regulation and improvement of the Great Roads of communication through the Province."

Passed the 29th of March 1820. THEREAS the Road leading from Fredericton to Northumber land as established in and by An Act made and passed in the fifty-sixth Year of His ever be concerned in trade, or any dealings Majesty's Reign, intituled " An Act for the establishment of the Great Roads of comminication throughout the Province," is to cross at the Forks of the River Miramichi to Babcock's, and to continue on that side of the said River to-Indian Town, and then to recross the same River; which part of the said Road having been found to be very inconvenient,

1. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council, and Assembly, that the said Road shall not in future cross and recross the said River, as aforesaid, but be continued on the Western side of the said River to Indian Town, and be laid out in such manner as the Supervisor or Supervisors shall think fit.

II. And whereas great inconvenience has arisen in consequence of the ordinary statute labour of ail persons residing upon the Great Roads of communication, being under the authority and direction of the Supervisor's of the said Roads as is provided in and by the tench section of the said herein before recited Act, Be it therefore further enacted, that the said tenth section of the same Act be, and the same is hereby repealed. And whereas great and unnecessary expenses have been ineurred, owing to the great number of Supervisors that were appointed in and by the third section of the same Act, and whereas it is found expedient to reduce, the number of the said Supervisors, 111. Be it therefore further. enacted, that the third section of the same Act be, and the same is hereby repealed : and that the persons therein named, be no longer hce. deemed as Supervisors, but that their powers as such do'cease, and be at an end ; saving where they may be necessary for the recovery of any forfeiture and penalties inflicted and incorred under and by virtue of the Provisions of the same Act ; and saving their liability to account for the monies en trusted to and received by them respectively Sopervisors aforesaid. IV. And be it further enacted, that the Lieutenant-Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being, by and with the advice of His Majes'y's Council, is hereby authorized and empowered to appoint, by warrant under his Hand and Seal, two fir and discreet persons to be Supervisors of the Great Roads throughout the Province; which persons, when so appointed, shall give security in the sum of three thousand Pounds each, and be sworn to the faithful discharge of their duty respectively, and be vested with all the powers and authority which the former Supervisors possessed, and be subject to all the restrictions, provisions and limitanons of the same Act, and of the Acts made .

VI. And be it further enacted, that in case of the death, or removal from office for misconduct, or either, or of both of the said Supervisors, the Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being. is hereby authorized and empowered to ap point, by and with the advice of His Ma jesty's Council, other fit person, or persons in the room of such Supervisor or Supervisors so deceased or removed from Of-

VII. And be it further enacted, that no Supervisor to be app inted under and by virtue of this Act, shall on any account whatin merchandize.

VIII. And be it further enacted, that all contracts to be made by the Supervisors or -ither of them. for labour and other expenditure for the Public Roads, shall be by them paid in the current money of the Province; and that the said Supervisors shall severally account in manner as required in and by the hrst herein before recued Act.

IX. And be it therefore enacted, that all the Great Roads as established by the said Act made in the fifty sixth year of His Majesty's Reign, and by the Acts made in addition thereto, and amendment thereof, as also by this Act, shall be divided into two Districts; the one District to comprise such parts of the Great Roads which lead through the following Counties, to wit, the Councies of Northumberland, Westmorland, Saint John, and King's; with the exception of that part of the Great Road which lies between the Le Proe River and the City of Saint John : - the other District to comprise such parts of the Great Roads which lead through the following Counties, namely, the Counties of York, Charlotte, Sunbury and Queen's, and that part of the Great Road which lies in the County of Saint John, between the Le Proe River and the City of Saint John : the one district to be superimended by one of the said Supervisors, and the other district by the other Supervisor, for the term of whenever it shall be represented to His Ex two.years; and at the expiration thereof, then to exchange Districts; and to continue to exchange every two years while in of-

The Certificate of the Surveyor-General oust also be obtained, that the district appli-I for is vacant Crown Land, and that there s no prior application to settle on the same, The Petition is then to be lodged at the Secretary's Office, to be submitted to the Lieutenant-Governor.

The Licence, if granted, will be given to in officer of the Surveyor-General's Deartment or to one of the Deputies of the Surveyor General of the Woods, as his auhority for inspecting and marking out the District therein described at the expence of e Petitioner. Previous to which a Bond nust be entered into to His Majesty, at the secretary's Office, at the rate of one shilling per . Fon for the quantity of Timber menioned in the Licence, and the established Fees of Office then paid in part of the sum pecified in the condition of the Bond. The officers in the Surveyor General's Department and those in the Department of the Surveyor-General of the Woods, are ereby strictly charged against marking out y District without the previous authority f a Licence granted as aforesaid, or a speial warrant under the Hand and Seal of the Lieutenant-Governor : and every Peron who shall enter upon the Crown Lands o cut Timber, before the District shall be narked out for him under such authority, will be prosecuted according to Law.
