STATE OF ENGLAND.

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It is very apparent (says the New-York Daily Advertiser) that the government of England intend to crush the conspirators by the strongarm of power. Advices from Santa Fe, New Grenada, have just been received, down to the 20th Sept, that the H. Qr's of the President had been broken up, and the army had taken the direction of the valley of Cucuta. This valley is the last position of the royalists on the north, and Quito on the South, in the whole range of Venezuela and New Granada; all the other provinces of New Grenada are already free or in complete insurrection against the royal authority.
