LEGISLATURE OF NEW-BRUNSWICK. (Extracts from the Journals.)

Friday, 11th February.

A Bill, "for the preservation of Deer in this Province."—was read a second time and ordered to be committed.

The House, resolved itself in a Committee on said Bill.

Mr. McKay, resumed the Chair of the Committee.

Mr. McKay, from the Committee, reported that they had gone through the Bill, without making any amendment thereto.

On motion of Mr. Agnew, ordered that the said Bill be recommitted to-morrow.

Read a second time, a Bill, "to provide payment for certain Public Services."

Ordered that the same be committed to-morrow.

A Message from His Excellency the LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR,
"G. S. Smyth.

"The LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR directs herewith to be laid before the House of Assembly, a copy of the Charter of Incorporation of the Madras School in New-Brunswick, together with a copy of a letter from Colonel the Honorable Sir ROBERT LE POER TRENCH; and recommends to the House, to make some suitable provision (in aid of the contributions of the Inhabitants) for the establishment of a branch of the said Provincial School in Fredericton: an object requiring more immediate attention, as it will appear by the letter, that the School of the 74th Regiment, which has been heretofore opened, through the benevolence of Sir ROBERT, for the instruction of the children of the poorer classes, will shortly be confined to Regimental purposes only.

"The LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR further recommends, that Legislative provision be made for convening special meetings of the Governor and Trustees of the said School, at the Seat of Government as well as in the City of Saint John, to which latter place, by the Charter, all those Meetings, as well as the annual Court or Meeting, are at present confined.

A Message from the Council.
Mr. Robinson delivered the Message, as follows:

"Mr. Speaker,—The Council have resolved that a Committee be appointed to join with such Committee as shall be appointed by the House of Assembly, to prepare an Address to His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT, deprecating the riotous and seditious practices of the disaffected in Great Britain.

Ordered that Mr. Agnew, Mr. Humbert, Mr. Peters, be the Committee for that purpose—and that Mr. Agnew and Mr. Humbert inform the Council therewith.

A Message from His Excellency the LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR, as follows:
"G. S. Smyth.

"The LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR directs to be laid before the House of Assembly, an Account of the Secretary of the Province, for preparing the Copies of the Laws of the last Session to be transmitted to England, amounting to £59 : 10 : 8— and His Excellency recommends to the House to make provision for payment of this account as one of the ordinary services of the Province.

A Bill, "to regulate certain Fees in the Supreme Court of this Province."—was read a second time and ordered to be committed to-morrow.

LOCKWOOD, Surveyor General of this Province, of his Survey of the Isthmus between the Waters of the Bay of Fundy and those of the Gulph of St. Lawrence, together with a plan thereof, and estimate of the expence of cutting a Canal.

On motion of Mr. C. Campbell, resolved that an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR, praying that His Excellency will be pleased to give such directions as he may think proper, for the printing and publication of the highly interesting report of the Honorable A. LOCKWOOD, Surveyor-General of this Province, of his Survey of the Isthmus—and that the House will make provision for defraying the expence thereof.

Mr. Ward and Mr. Peters were appointed a Committee to wait upon His Excellency with the Address.

The Committee appointed to bring in a Bill, "to continue the several Acts of the General Assembly that have expired or are near expiring," brought in a Bill for that purpose.

Saturday, 12th February.

The House, resolved itself into Committee of the whole House, on consideration of the Bill, "to provide payment for certain public services."

A Bill, "to continue several Acts of the General Assembly that are near expiring," and a Bill, "to continue 3 Acts of the General Assembly that are near expiring, for the increase of the Revenue of this Province."—was read the first time.

Mr. Speaker communicated to the House, a letter he received from the Speaker of the House of Assembly in Nova-Scotia, since the dissolution of the late House, accompanied by a joint report of the Council and Assembly of that Province, on the subject of the Convention concluded between His Majesty and the United States of America.—which were on the table.

Mr. Agnew, from the Committee appointed to wait upon His Excellency with the Address of the House of Thursday last,

reported that they had attended to that duty, when His Excellency was pleased to say, he would cheerfully comply with the wishes of the House.

Mr. Ward, from the Committee appointed to wait upon His Excellency with the Address of yesterday, reported that they had attended to that duty, and His Excellency was pleased to say, he would most cheerfully comply with the wishes of the House.

Monday, 14th February.

Messages from His Excellency the LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR.

"G. S. Smyth.

"The LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR acquaints the House of Assembly, that since the Staff of the Militia has been discontinued from Home, he has found it necessary to avail himself of the assistance of a Gentleman to perform the duties of the Adjutant-General's department to the Militia of the Province, and trusts to the liberality of the House to make a future provision for so necessary an appointment.

"The LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR directs to be laid herewith before the House of Assembly, the report of the Attorney-General of the proceedings relating to the steps which have been taken in the recovery of money from Captain Brenton, on account of the sloop Brunswicker, with the whole of the Correspondence between the Attorney-General and Mr. Bonnour, the Province Agent in England, on that subject, and sundry documents accompanying the same, by which it will appear, that those Officers have had much trouble in carrying into execution the wishes of the House, as expressed in their Address of the 14th March, 1817.

Upon which the Committee divided as follows:—YEAS, 12—NAYS, 7.

Ordered that the order of the day made the 5th inst. for the hearing by Counsel of the Petition of the Lessees or Assignees of College Lands, in Fredericton, be discharged.

Mr. C. Campbell, presented a Bill, "to confirm certain conveyances made by the Governor and Trustees of the College of New-Brunswick." Which was read a first time.

Ordered that the same be read the second time on Tuesday the 22d instant, and that the Parties be then heard by Counsel at the Bar of this House, in support thereof.
