

ported twenty three resolutions which he read in his place, and delivered in at the Clerk's table, where being again severally read, were agreed to by the House, and are as follow :

To John Chaloner, for Gauging and Weighing in the year 1819, the sum of £170 : 6 : 6.

To His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, a sum not exceeding £3000, to be paid for the encouragement of the Cod Fisheries of this Province, agreeable to a Law of this Province, for the year 1820.

To the President and Directors of Saint Andrews Grammar School, the sum of £100, towards defraying the expenses of a Master for the year 1820, agreeable to a Law of this Province.

To the Keeper of the Light-House on Partridge Island, the sum of £150, for his services for the year 1820.

To His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, for the purpose of enabling the Treasurer to pay Alexander Miller, a Tide-Waiter in the City of St. John, for his services as such, from the 28th day of March, 1819, until the 28th day of March, 1820, the sum of £68 : 8 : 9.

To the Commissioners to be appointed by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, towards defraying the expenses of a Courier between Fredericton and Newcastle, in the County of Northumberland, for the year 1820, the sum of £125.

To three such Commissioners as His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor may appoint, a sum not exceeding £150, for the support of a Packet to ply between Digby and St. John, for one year, to commence from the 5th day of April next, provided a similar provision is made by the Legislature of the Province of Nova-Scotia, and no Packet is established at the exclusive expense of the General Post-Office for that purpose.

To the Governor and Trustees of the College of New-Brunswick, the sum of £250, for the year 1820, conformably to the provisions of the two Acts of the General Assembly.

To the President and Directors of the Saint John Grammar School, for the year 1820, the sum of £250, agreeable to the provisions of the two Acts of the General Assembly.

To the President and Directors of the Saint Andrews Grammar School, the sum of £100, in addition to the sum heretofore allowed, conformable to a Bill passed during the present Session, towards the further support of a Master, for the year 1820.

To Thomas Wetmore, Esq. the Attorney-General for this Province, the sum of £100, for past services.

To His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, the sum of £50, towards defraying the expense of Printing the Laws of the present Session.

To Samuel Buchanan, the sum of £20, for airing and taking care of the Province Hall, for the year 1819.

To the Adjutant of the 2d Battalion Charlotte County Militia, the sum of £5, to remunerate him for expences incurred in hiring a Boat during his attendance on Militia duty, in the year 1819.

To the Sheriffs of the several Counties in this Province, for executing Writs of Election and returning the Members to serve in General Assembly, the following sums to wit,

To the Sheriff of the County of York, the sum of £25.

To the Sheriff of the County of Westmorland, the sum of £25.

To the Sheriff of the County of Sunbury, the sum of £25.

To the Sheriff of the County of Charlotte, the sum of £25.

Mr. Wheeler, presented two Petitions from a Committee of the Chamber of Commerce of St. John--praying that an alteration may be made in that part of the Revenue Act which regulates drawbacks, and that such steps may be taken as may relieve them from the payment of the King's duty on certain articles imported into St. John, and exported to the United States.

Which were received, and ordered to lie on the table.

"The Lieutenant-Governor submits to the House of Assembly, a Petition to His Worship the Mayor of Saint John, from certain persons who were saved from a wreck at sea, and brought to that City, together with the Treasurer's account of expenditure under His Excellency's sanction in this behalf: and he trusts to the liberality of the Honorable House to provide for the same."

Mr. Peters, brought in a Bill, "in addition to an Act, intitled "an Act to authorise the Justices of the Peace for the City and County of St. John, to levy an assess-

Mr. C. Campbell, by leave, presented a Petition of the President and Directors of the Charlotte County Agricultural and Emigrant Society—praying aid towards the support of the Institution.—referred to the Committee of Supply.

Mr. C. Campbell, presented a Bill, "to exempt the Firemen in the Towns of St. Andrews and Fredericton, from the performance of certain public services."—Which was read the first time.
