LEGISLATURE OF NEW-BRUNSWICK.

[Extracts from the Journals.]

Thursday, 17th February.

Mr. Agnew, from the Committee of supply, reported sundry resolutions, which he read in his place, and delivered in at the Clerk's table, where being again severally read, were agreed to by the House—and are as follow:

To the Treasurer of the Province, to defray expenses incurred by him for Stationary, Advertising, Blanks, &c. £21 : 9 : 6, for the year 1819.

To His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, a sum not exceeding £3000. to be paid in Bounties for the encouragement of raising Bread Corn on new Lands, agreeably to a Law of this Province, for the year 1820.

To the Commissioners to be appointed to superintend the road leading from Gaspereau Bridge to Cape Tormentine, the sum of £100. to lay out and improve the said Road—the same being a regrant of that sum voted in 1816. for said Road.

COUNTY OF YORK.

The sum of £30 towards improving the Road from Fredericton to the Maryland Settlement. £150 towards improving the Roads and Bridges from the River Nashwalkis to the mouth of the Kiswick Creek. £40 towards opening a Road from the Nashwalkis to the head of the Cardigan Settlement of Welch Emigrants. £25 towards opening a Road from John McKen's on the Macdequack Stream to the new Settlement in the rear thereof. £10 towards improving the Road from the Nashwalkis Mill to Han-Town Settlement. £40 towards opening a road from the settlement of Emigrants on the nine mile lake (Prince William) to the River. £50 towards improving the Roads from George Jarvis' to Jacob Ellegood's. £50 towards improving the Road from Jacob Ellegood's to Adam Allan's on the Poquioch. £25 towards improving the Road from the Poquioch to Ingraham's mill. £25 towards improving the Road from Ingraham's Mill to Eel River. £25 for the Road from Eel River to the Woodstock Ferry. £50 towards improving the Road from Woodstock to the Richmond settlement. £30 towards opening the Road from Richmond

Settlement to a new Settlement in the Rear thereof. £40 towards opening a Road from the River to the Jackson Settlement. £50 for the Road from Joseph Woverton's to Robert Phillips', Northampton. £50 for the Road from Robert Phillips' to E. Tompkins. £70 towards opening the Road from Elijah Tompkins' to the Tobique River on the East side. £30 towards opening the Road from the River Tobique to Salmon River on the East side. £30 towards improving the Poquioch Road.

COUNTY OF NORTHUMBERLAND.

The sum of £175 to explore, lay out, and open a Road from the River Nepisiguit to the River Restigouch. £50 to open and improve a Road from the new Settlement near the head of the tide on Napan River to the River Miramichi, near the Church in Chatham. £50 towards opening and improving a Road through the Indian Land from Caul's Cove to Patrick Taylor's. £50 towards completing a Bridge across Fleet's Cove in the Parish of Nelson. £50 towards completing a Bridge over Clark's Cove in the Parish of Chatham. £20 towards exploring, laying out, and opening a Road from the new Settlement on the River Napan near the head of the Tide to Black River. £40 towards improving the Road from Black River to Dennis' Creek. £20 towards improving the Road from Négac to Tabisintack. £20 towards improving the Road from Tabisintack to Tracadu. £40 towards improving the Road from Tracadu to Caraket. £100 from Point Escumencac to Richibucto. £75 from Richibucto to Buctouche. £75 from Buctouche to Shediac.

The Sum of £50 for building a Bridge over the Moranci Stream on the North-west branch of the Oroonoto. £50 for building a Bridge and repairing the Road from the County line at Mr. Morgan's to John Nason's, Rushagannes. £50 to build a floating Bridge across the thoroughfare near John Upton's, in Sheffield. £25 for building a Bridge and repairing the Road leading to Calvin Camp's in Lincoln. £25 towards finishing a Bridge over the North branch Stream, near Thomas Hart's, Oroonoto. £25 for opening a Road from Samuel Smith's, in Gary, to the French Lake Stream. £20 towards improving the Road from the County Line to the Settlement at Little River, in Sheffield. £20 to open a Road from the main Road,

to Burton, to the Settlement in the rear of the front Lots near James Chase's.

QUEEN'S COUNTY.

The sum of £200 for the road from the river Saint John, near Richard Curran's, to the Thoroughfare. £60 for the road from New-Castle to Lodowick Cypher's. £50 for the road from the Grand Lake to the Washademoac Lake. £60 for the road from Cumberland Point to the Widow Wiggins'. £50 for the road from the Cannan settlement to Studholm's Mill-stream. £20 for the road from George Henry's to the Jemseg. £25 for the road from the New-Ireland settlement to Marcus Palmer's. £25 for the road from the settlement back of Kemball's grant to the river Saint John. £25 from George Henry's to the great road near Briggs'. £25 for to open a road from Long Creek, near the head of Washademoac Lake, to the great road near the Studholm Mill-stream.
