

LEGISLATURE OF NEW-BRUNSWICK.

[Extracts from the Journals.]

Friday, 18th February.

Mr. Agnew, from the select Committee appointed to take into consideration the recommendation of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor's Speech relating to the improvement of the navigation of the rivers of this Province, reported as follows:

FOR YORK.

The sum of £75 towards removing rocks in the great Nashwalk rapid, and making a towing path along the same.

The sum of £15 towards removing the rocks in the rapid between Mix Todd's and Doctor Clark's.

The sum of £50 towards improving the Chapel Bar above Fredericton.

The sum of £100 towards improving the Bear Island Bar.

The sum of £50 towards removing rocks in the Narauquiwicket Creek, where the road crosses the same.

The sum of £150 towards improving the passage through the Meductic Falls, and making a towing path along the same.

The sum of £25 towards removing Feroc's rocks (commonly so called) in the river St. John.

The sum of £25 towards removing the rocks in Betts' rapid in the river St. John.

The sum of £50 towards improving the passage of the grand Bar in the river St. John.

The sum of £50 for making towing paths and removing rocks between the Presqu' Isle and the Restook river.

The sum of £150 for removing rocks and making towing paths from Restook river to the Grand Falls.

FOR SUNBURY.

The sum of £75 towards deepening the Oromocto Shoals, so called.

The sum of £25 towards clearing out the mouth of Simonds' Creek, so called.

FOR QUEEN'S.

The sum of £300 towards deepening the Shoal at the head of the Jemseg, leading into the Grand Lake.

FOR KING'S.

The sum of £100 towards removing the rocks and other obstacles in the Kennebeckacis river, from Smith's rapids upwards.

FOR ST. JOHN.

The sum of £100 towards removing obstructions in Mispick river, leading from the lower Loch-Lomond to the Bay of Fundy.

FOR CHARLOTTE.

The sum of £200 for removing rocks from the channel of the river St. Croix and its branches, within this Province.

The sum of £75 for removing rocks and facilitating the navigation of the river Magaguadavic, above the second Falls.

The sum of £50 for removing rocks from the channel of the Digdiguash river.

The sum of £25 be granted for the removal of obstructions in the Piskihagan river.

FOR NORTHUMBERLAND.

The sum of £50 for removing rocks in the channel of the S.W. branch of the river Miramichi, at the black rapids.

The sum of £100 towards removing the rocks in the said river, at the white rapids.

FOR WESTMORLAND.

The sum of £100 towards facilitating the navigation of the N.W. branch of the Petticodiac river.

The sum of £50 on the Shediac river, for the same purpose.

A Message from the Council.
"Council Chamber, Friday 18th February, 1820.

"Mr. Speaker,--Resolved that Mr. Robinson be a Committee with such Committee as shall be appointed by the House of Assembly, to wait upon the Lieutenant-Governor with an Address--praying that His Excellency will be pleased to transmit the joint Address of the Council and House of Assembly, to be laid before His Royal Highness the Prince Regent."

£25 towards cleaning out the mouth of Simonds' Creek, so called.

FOR KING'S COUNTY.

£100 towards removing the rocks and other obstacles in the Kennebeckacis river, from Smith's rapids upwards.

FOR THE COUNTY OF SAINT JOHN.

£100 towards removing obstructions in Mispick river, leading from the lower Loch-Lomond to the Bay of Fundy.

FOR THE COUNTY OF CHARLOTTE.

£200 for removing rocks from the channel of the river St. Croix and its branches, within this Province.

£75 for removing rocks and facilitating the navigation of the Magaguadavic, above the second Falls.

£50 for removing rocks from the channel of the Digdiguash river.

FOR THE COUNTY OF NORTHUMBERLAND.

£50 for removing rocks in the channel of the S.W. branch of the river Miramichi, at the black rapids.

£100 towards removing the rocks in the said river, at the white rapids.

FOR THE COUNTY OF WESTMORLAND.

£100 towards facilitating the navigation of the N.W. branch of the Petticodiac river.

£50 for the same purpose on the Shediac river.

£25 for the removal of obstructions in the Piskihagan.
