### LEGISLATURE OF NEW-BRUNSWICK. [Extracts from the Journal ]

Monday, 5th February. Mr. Stubs brought in a bill, " to ascertain ratable Estates in this Province, and for other purposes therein mentioned", which was read the first time;

Mr. Clarke, presented a Petition of John Frink and James Frink, praying that the difference paid by them into the Province Treasury, between the long and short duties on certain West India produce imported by them, may be granted to them,---and Mr. Fraser, a Petition of the Church Wardens. and Vestry, of the Parish Church in St. Mary's, praying aid towards completing the Church in that Parish, and Mr. Wetmore, a Petition of the Church Wardens, in the Parish of Westfield, King's County, praying aid towards repairing injury done to the Church in that Parish by fire. Which were referred to the Committee of Supply.

Mr. Smith brought in a bill, " to repeal an Act, intituled "An Act for the further increase of the Revenue of this Province," passed 25th March 1820 ; and also " An Act in addition to an Act, intituled "An Act for the further increase of the Revenue of this Province," passed 29th March 1820." Which was read the first time. Mr. Wetmore obtained leave to bring in a bill, " for the preservation of the Red and Fallow Deer in this Province." Mr. Chipman presented a Petition of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commonalty, of the City of Saint John, praying for authority to levy a further sum not exceeding £500, on the inhabitants of the said City, for the purpose of building and finishing the Poor-House in the said City-ordered to lie on the table. Mr. Chipman, brought in a bill, " to authouise the Justices of the Peace for the City and County of Saint John, to levy a further assessment on the inhabitants of the said City, for the purpose of building and finishing a Poor-House in the said City." Which was read the first and second time.

#### Tuesday, 6th February.
