

The Earl Moira wreck.—The number of persons rescued from death, by the boats, proves to be 71; and 31 bodies of persons drowned have been picked up; making a total of 102. It was reckoned that there were 110 persons on board. Wm. M. Leish, Esq. of Glasgow, who was one of the sufferers, has left £1000 to the different public charities of that city. The donations, though merely mentioned in a letter two years ago, the legal heirs of Mr. M. Leish have confirmed in the most disinterested manner, without even the deduction of the legacy duty.

The Government of the Ionian Islands, has issued two proclamations denouncing the punishment of piracy against such Ionian vessels as should aid the Greeks against the Turks.

The intercourse between the Courts of France and Turkey, has become more frequent than ever. Couriers pass and repass daily.

The King of England is expected to embark for his German dominions about the middle of September. Magnificent preparations are making for his Coronation as King of Hanover.

The harvest in England promised an abundant crop.

NEW YORK, Oct. 20.

An article, of Sept. 4, dated London, 1 o'clock P. M. is as follows;—

"We have been favoured with the perusal of a letter received this morning, dated Constantinople, Aug. 6. It came by the French mail, the writer taking advantage of an express sent off by the French Ambassador to Paris. This letter is transmitted to a highly respectable mercantile house in the city, and we place some reliance upon its contents. It states that as Turkey has agreed to all the terms demanded by Russia, war was out of the question; the document, however being delivered two hours too late, had occasioned the Turkish Government to send two special messengers to St. Petersburg.—Baron Strogouoff continued wind-bound on the 7th August and a confident opinion was entertained that the answer would be back from the Russian capital so as to prevent his departure. The Turkish fleet had taken refuge in the Island of Stancho, four Greek fire ships had been sent in there without effect. The Insurgents with a strong squadron were at Samos. At Smirna, the greatest order prevailed; the Turks were punished if they entered the Greek quarter of the town."

Very unfavourable reports regarding the state of the harvests in England and on the Continent, have reached us via the United States—the consequence has been a very unlooked for rise in the price of flour. We had always some reason to doubt the authenticity of intelligence from such a quarter, especially when the interests of our neighbours were concerned; but in the present instance, the most implicit confidence has been placed on their truth, by the holders of that article. We sincerely hope that the fortunes thus anticipated to be made, by the Americans and some individuals amongst ourselves, may not be realized, when such an eagerness is shewn to take advantage of appearances only. The state of the country will not permit it; unless the price of labour rises in proportion, it is evident that more than the real value of the article cannot be given; we must then only look for another addition to our Poor Rates, if the holders persist in their demand. But we need not depend solely upon them for the necessities of life: let us restrict ourselves to the use of the productions of our own country, before we would encourage such speculators.
