CARLO FORTI, cross-examined by the Attorney General.

Are you still in the service of the Princess ? Yes. Did you travel with her as courier in

saw him at St. Omers.

Did he travel with the Princess as far as

St. Omers ? He did. Do you know the wife of Bergami? I do.

Where does she live? At Milan.

I believe Bergami is called the Baron de la Francina? He is.

Do you know is his wife styled the Baroness de la Francina? I never heard her so

called. Have you ever seen Bargami's wife in the company of her Royal Highness?

Never. Whereabouts does Bergami's wife reside at Milan? She lives near the Port de Chinese.

. Describe particularly the style in which she lives? I have never been in her house to tell what she does or does no.

Has she any servants? Yes, she has a man servant, and a maid, who performs the duties of a waiting maid.

How long has Bergami's wife lived there? I have seen her only there-I do not know where she lived before.

Do you know the name of the man servant ? No.

How do you know that she has a man servant? I have seen him once there; his name I don't know.

Then you have been in the house? I have said I have been there once."

When was that ? How do you expect I should remember; it may be about a year ago.

Do you say it is about a year ago? Yes. On what occasion was it that you went to her house? I took a letter to her. From whom? Her husband.

Where was Bergami then? At Pesaro. Do you know any other of the family of Bergami? The other relations of his -his brother.

Is his brother the only relation you knew of? There are others—his cousins.

What are their names? There are Bernardo and Francesco.

Are these the only relations of his you know of? There are others whom I do not know of.

Do you know no others but those you have mentioned? Yes; his sisters .- What are their names? Faustina.

Do you know any others? I do not. Did you ever see the Countess Oldi?

Yes. Is she any relation of Bergami? Yes,

his sister. Where have you seen her? I have al-

ways seen her in the service of the Princess. Do you remember any other relation of Bergami's that you have not mentioned? No other in the house of the Princess.

Am I then to understand that all those you have mentioned are in the house of the Princess? They were all once.

In what situation was the Countess Oldi? She was dame d'honeur.

What was Faustina? She kept an account of the linen.

Louis? He was equerry. Bernardo? Pretect of the palace. Francesco? He was accomptant.

You have lived four years with the Princess, and you never saw any other of Bergami's family living with the Princess? No other.

Do you know Bergami's mother ? Yes. Did she ever-live in the service of the Princess ? She came to pass a few days at Caprini.

How long did she remain there? Two months.

Do you mean by a few days' two months? Mr. Brougham .-- The witness has said that she came to pass a few days but that she remained two months. It often happens that a person who comes upon a short visit is induced to prolong it .-- (A laugh.)

Where did Bergami's mother usually live ? At Milan.

What part of the town? I do not know. Where did Bergami's mother live at the Villa Caprini? Sometimes with Her Royal Highness; and sometimes by herself. -

Where did Faustina dine? In her own Always? I cannot say always; she

did not dine with the others, but by her-Where did Louis dine? With her Royal

Highness at times. Where did Francesco dine? At our

Do you know Marchini the husband of

Faustina ? Yes. Where does he live? At Milan.

Did Marchini dine one day at the Villa d'Este? I do not know, as I was not then in the service of her Royal Highness.

You have said that Bergami accompanied her Majesty to St. Omer; did any other of her servants accompany her Majesry to St. Omer? No one else.

Where did she leave them? Some as Milan, some at Pesaro.
