Accounts had reached London from Constantinople, to the 26th March, by way of Odessa, which state, that up to the 25th the Reis Effendi had not replied to the note of the mediating ministers.

Letters from Odessa, of April 2^d, mention that there were no indications of approaching hostilities from Constantinople, and that there was nothing of a hostile nature from St. Petersburg.

There is a considerable talk on Change to day, (London April 29th), as to what is the object of the proprietors of the Banks, who are summoned to meet on Thursday. It is conjectured to be for the purpose of fixing the rate of discount at 4 per cent, which certainly could not be thought of, if war was likely to take place. Consols to day 78 $\frac{1}{2}$.

The Madrid papers of the 14th instant, contain the particulars of a very important discussion which took place in the Cortes relative to the Transatlantic Provinces. A report was made to the Assembly by the Committee on the affairs of the Colonies, in which it recognized the expediency of entering into negotiations with those Provinces that have declared their independence; and of establishing commercial relations with them, suitable to both hemispheres.

Considerable debate followed and it was finally determined to send commissioners for the purpose of receiving the proposals of the South American Governments. The intention of the United States to recognise the independence of these Governments was not known to the Cortes at the time of this discussion.

Lord John Russell's motion in the House of Commons for a Parliamentary Reform, was negatived by a majority of 105.

The British shipping has decreased in the last two years, 416 vessels, or 106,194 tons, and the decrease of seamen employed, is 5,199 men.

The Robert Fulton, Holdredge, was engaged at Liverpool, to take the place of the Albion, and to sail for New-York on the 16th.

A banking house in the county of Norfolk, which had hitherto sustained unlimited confidence, has stopped payment. Its credit was extensive throughout the county.

The 71st Regiment, under command of Lieut. Colonel A. Jones, is on its way from Chatham to Ireland.
