**PHILADELPHIA, SEPT. 2.**

Captain Blythe, of the Albert, left at Ponce, 18th August, the following vessels, prizes to Spanish privateers,--sch'r Eagle, of Washington, condemned sometime since; English brig Zalla, Oliver, of London, from Cadiz, bound to Vera Cruz, condemned; also, English brig Phoebe, Mackie, of Saint John, New Brunswick, from Lagaira bound to Hamburg, was captured off the east end of St. Croix, by a Spanish Felucca, who fired three 18 pounders and several volleys of musketry into the brig, after she hove too, which cut away two of the shrouds, much of the running rigging, and many went through her sails; fortunately no one on board was injured. At the time of capture, the Captain was in an ill state of health; after being three days in the port of Ponce, without any medical aid or communication with the shore, Mr. Wustine, a Merchant and Planter, went alongside of the prize, to offer the Captain any assistance he might need, but was ordered off and not allowed to see him; Captain Mackie hearing some one inquiring for him, attempted to get on deck, but was prevented by the Prize Master. A representation being made to the Judge, he ordered the Captain to be brought before him. Being asked what he had to say in defence of his vessel, he replied, "Nothing, his soul was of more concern to him." On the 16th, (3 days after) he departed this life, leaving a wife and 5 children.
