Each. I proceed this afternoon to the neighbourhood of Culsically, and the Islands near Shabazpoor, from the latter only partial reports have been received of their disastes, but from the former I am concerned to say, there has been positive accounts received this day from the Thanadar, stating that about twelve thousand people are already ascertained to be lost in that Thanah alone, which is in addition to those I have already reported, and many of the remaining inhabitants are still living upon grain that was wet and dried again, which it is to be feared will cause much sickness.
