A Proclamation.

WHEREAS several Persons have memorialled for Licences to cut Pine Timber off the Crown Lands, without coming forward to take out the same, and have their Births surveyed agreeably to regulation—Such Persons are hereby cautioned against proceeding to cut the Timber applied for, under the penalty of being proceeded against in common with other Trespassers.

A list will be published in the Royal Gazette, of the names of those Persons who have taken out their Licences and complied with all the requisite conditions; after which notification, no more Licences will be granted for the present Season.

To all whom it may concern Greeting:
NOTICE is hereby given that upon the application of James Wood, to me duly made according to the form of the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided, I have directed all the estate as well real as personal within this Province, of Thomas A. Hammond, late of the City of Saint John (which same Thomas A. Hammond is departed from and out of the limits of this Province, with intent and design to defraud the said James Wood, and the other creditors of the said Thomas A. Hammond, (if any there be) of their just dues, or else to avoid being arrested by the ordinary process of the Law as it is alleged against him) to be seized and attached; and that unless the said Thomas A. Hammond do return and discharge the said debt or debts, within three months from the Publication hereof, all the estate as well real as personal of the said Thomas A. Hammond within this Province will be sold for the payment and satisfaction of the Creditors of the said Thomas A. Hammond.

HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY.

Saturday, 22d February.

Mr. Wetmore moved for leave to bring in a bill, "to alter and amend an Act intitled "An Act to establish Grammar Schools in several Counties in this Province." Leave granted.

Mr. Wetmore, by leave, presented a Petition of the Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry, of Trinity Church, in the Parish of Kingston, in King's County, praying that a Law might pass to authorize them to exchange a part of the School Lot for lands belonging to Walter Bates, Esq. and also to enable them to convey to His Majesty's Justices of the Peace of the said County, a portion of the aforesaid Lot, in order to secure the County buildings to the said Justices.

Which he read in his place. Ordered that the same be received and lie on the table.

Mr. Wetmore moved for leave to bring in a bill, "to authorize and empower the

Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry, of Trinity Church, in the Parish of Kingston, in King's County, to make certain conveyances of Lands now held by them in trust, in exchange for other Lands, and for other purposes therein mentioned." Leave granted.

Mr. J. Wilmot, by leave, presented a Petition of Richard Slack, praying pecuniary aid to enable him to keep an establishment for the accommodation of Travellers, on the road between the Loch Lomond and Black River Settlements, in the County of Saint John.

Which he read in his place. Ordered that the same be received and referred to the Committee of Supply.

The House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, in further consideration of the bill, "to repeal the Acts for regulating, laying out, and repairing Highways and Roads, and for appointing Commissioners and Surveyors of Highways within the several Towns and Parishes in this Province, and to make more effectual provision for the same."

Mr. Speaker left the chair.
Mr. R. Simonds took the chair of the committee.

Mr. Speaker resumed the chair.
Mr. Simonds, from the Committee, reported that they had made further progress in the bill to them referred, and that he was directed to move for leave to sit again.

Ordered that the report be accepted and leave granted.

Mr. R. Simonds, by leave, presented a Petition of a number of Merchants and Traders of Miramichi, praying that a Law may be passed in order to punish persons detected in picking up, defacing, and selling Timber found drifting in the Miramichi River.

Which he read in his place. Ordered that the same be received and lie on the table.

On motion, the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, on a bill "in amendment of the Laws now in force for the support and relief of confined Debtors, and for the further relief of Debtors with respect to the imprisonment of their persons."

Mr. Speaker left the chair.
Mr. Johnston took the chair of the committee.

Mr. Speaker resumed the chair.
Mr. Johnston, from the Committee, reported that they had gone into further consideration of the bill to them referred, and had agreed to the same with amendments—

Which he read in his place and delivered in at the Clerk's table, where being again read as amended, was agreed to by the House.

Ordered that the report be accepted and the bill as amended be engrossed.

Mr. H. Peters, Chairman from the Committee appointed to examine the Treasurer's accounts, reported as follows:

In the Province Treasurer's general account No. 11, he credits a remittance of £513 14 3

F, is the Deputy Treasurer's account current. He omits to credit the amount of cash on hand 31st December, 1821, £33 2 9 3/4. He charges his remittance to the Province Treasurer, £352 2 1 1/2, being £161 11 8 less than the Province Treasurer in his general account No. 11, credits him. He charges bonds put in suit £107 10 0, and a warrant on the Treasury, £26 6 0—leaving a balance in bonds in office by his statement, £415 7 2 1/2. This account requires explanation—he has not forwarded any statement of the money collected on account of sick and disabled Seamen.

G, is the account of ordinary duties collected at St. Andrews in 1822, amount £8251 13 1 1/2

H, is the account of duties on Live Stock, in 1822, 214 0 0

He charges £165 2 6, not credited in the Province Treasurer's general account. He charges for Printing and Postages, £1 18 4, and £34 4, paid the Gauger at Saint Andrews. Your Committee are not informed what proportion of the same was collected by the Attorney General in 1822, and paid over to the Province Treasurer.

From the above is to be deducted drawbacks and appropriations, for which warrants have not been issued, amounting to a very considerable sum.

The Province Treasurer recommends an increase of salary to the Tidewater at Saint John, of 1s. 3d. per day.

No credit is given either by the Treasurer or any of his Deputies, for any difference on cash in hand caused by the change of currency, as directed by a resolve of the House, on the 26th February last.

Your Committee beg to recommend, that the Loan for which the Province is paying interest, be paid off.
