The following regulations made for the Government of the Firemen, are published by order of the Firewards.

1. That every fireman shall forthwith provide himself with a leather Cap, painted white; agreeable to a pattern to be deposited by the Firewards, with one of the Captains of the Engine.

2d Upon any alarm of fire, every fireman shall immediately repair to the Engine No. 1. with his Cap on; and put himself under the directions of the Captain of that Engine; and that every fireman knowing of an alarm of fire, and not complying with this Rule, shall be subject to the penalty of twenty shillings, to be recovered as the Law directs.

3d. That the Captains of the Engine No. 1. do immediately on any alarm of fire, proceed to the Engine House with their Keys, and as soon as they can collect sufficient assistance, proceed without delay with the Engine, Buckets, Ladders, Hooks, &c. to the place where the fire is, and there put themselves under the direction of a Fireward if any there present, and if none present, then to proceed to use the Engine in extinguishing the Fire, according to the best of their own judgement until a Fireward arrives, and for any neglect of duty shall be subject to the penalty of twenty shillings.

4th. That every Captain of the Engine shall provide himself with a Key of the Engine House, and that the same shall also be an extra Key deposited near to the Engine House, where it can be immediately had.

5th. And that after any fire may be extinguished, no Fireman shall leave the Engine without permission of a Fireward, until the same (with Ladders, Buckets, and all the Furniture thereto belonging) shall be regularly deposited and secured in the place appointed for that purpose, under the penalty of five shillings for each offence—to be recovered as the act directs.

6th. That every Captain of the said Engine when required so to do, by any of the Firewards, shall summon the rest of the Firemen to meet at the Engine House, at such times as may be appointed by the Firewards, not exceeding twelve times in each year, for the purpose of examining the Engine, and exercising themselves in the use thereof as the Firewards then present may direct, under the penalty of five shillings for every neglect thereof, to be recovered as aforesaid: That every Fireman being so summoned, neglecting to appear at the time appointed, shall be subject to the penalty of two shillings and sixpence for each offence, to be recovered as aforesaid.

From the N. B. Courier, 5th of April.

We have seen a private letter from Paris, which intimates that England has made a decided conclusion to espouse the cause of Spain—and she is represented to have come to this determination from learning that Russia had been carrying on a secret correspondence with the French Government with a view to urge that Government to adopt effectual measures against the rising liberties of the Peninsula; promising assistance in case of necessity. In this statement there is a very high probability, and we are inclined to give it all the credit possible. A few weeks will unravel the whole matter.
