DOVER, March 16 .- By a person who left Matour drid on the 2d inst. we learn, that one hundred thousand French troops are in barracks on one side of the Bidassoa, and the Spanish army on the other The roads in France, leading to the frontiers, are covered with troops for upwards of 300 miles, and carriages, with flat bottomed boats, pontoons, cannon and ammunition of all descriptions. He left Madrid on the ad; the King was then preparing for his departure It is the opinion that the Spaniards will not give battle, but endeavor to cut off the French army when they have entered the country, by a sort of guerilla warfare, &c. The Portuguese are advancing to join the Spaniards. Lord Leveson Gower arrived yesterday with dispatches, all the military have been marched from Calais towards the frontiers of Spain, and they have commenced mounting the cannon on the ramparts of Calais.

A gentleman has arrived in town from Spain, who passed through the French army in the neighbourhood of Bayonne. 'He says they are in the best order, and eager to enter Spain; he also adds, that the Spaniards are fully resolved to abide the event of invasion—and most persons of property are removing their valuables from Madrid. 
