TRIPOLIZZA. MAY 4. The Greek national assembly, after completing its labour in peace and tranquil Iny, broke up on the 30th of April All the provincial governments existing before this meeting, these of Peloponesus, of Wes tern Greece, and of Arecra rus, are abolished and all Greece is now under one central democratic government, consisting of two branches, the legislative anthority, of which the Presid-nt is George Konturion, of the celebrated Lazaro Konturioti, who is at the head of the affairs of Hydra : and the Executive, the President of which is Pereo Maurocordate, fermerly Prince of Maine, and known by the name of Pierro Bey .---The government has already issued many ordinances; it has also addressed a proclamation to the European nations, in which it returns thanks for the assistance which inetvidual friends on humanity have hisherto afforded to the Greeks.
