JULY 4.
We have received the French papers of Friday. It does not appear from these papers that any of the reports of the change in the French Ministry, or of the other political events with which the speculators on our exchange have been alarmed are confirmed. A report is brought by the private letters that the King of France is dangerously ill; but it seems to be discredited by the intelligence of the Pilote, that on Thursday he was well enough to transact business with M. de Villele, at St. Cloud.

PARIS, JULY 14.—In digging the foundation for the New Church of St. Germain-en-Laye, three leaden boxes were found, on the site of an old chapel, on one of which was the following inscription:—"Here is a portion of the flesh and the noble parts of the body of the Most High, Most Potent, and Most Excellent Prince James Stuart, second of that name, King of Great Britain, born 23, 1633; died in France at St. Germain-en-Laye, the 16th of Sept. 1701.

The Mayor, when informed of this discovery, immediately repaired to the spot, and, in presence of the Governor of the Chateau, of the Curate of the Parish, and several Members of the Municipal Council, caused these precious remains to be resumed and deposited under the high altar of the Provisional Church.

The archives of the Mayoralty were immediately consulted, when, under date of the 16th September, 1701, were found the acts proving the death of the Prince, and stating that his entrails and brains were deposited in the Church of St. Germain.

It is certain that one of the other boxes contains the remains of the Princess Louisa Maria of England, daughter of King James the Second, that Princess having died at St. Germain, the 17th of April, 1712.

It is said that the English rank propose to erect a monument in this place, where the remains of this Prince will be deposited, whose misfortunes Louis XIV. contributed to soothe with so much magnanimity.—*Journal des Debats.*

Since the death of Lord Byron, most of the English officers have quitted the Greek army. Amongst the number is Colonel Stanhope.

Melancholy Accidents!—On Saturday the 31st ultimo, a boat containing the Rev. Abraham Wood, Mr. Ashton, and his hired man, together with a fourth person, left this City for their residence in Grand Lake. From what we have learned, they got into the Lake in the evening, which was very fine; but in a moment a squall arose, that upset the boat, by which accident, Mr. Ashton and his hired man were drowned. Mr. Wood was miraculously preserved by the assistance of the fourth person, under Divine Providence, who helped him to cling to the boat, until near day-light, when they were relieved from their perilous situation by some person who heard their cries. Mr. Wood was so much exhausted when taken up, that it remained doubtful if he survived the accident, but had somewhat recovered when this account came away; and is presumed will do well. We understand his loss in money and articles which were on board the boat, is nearly £150.

On Wednesday last, Mr. John Godsoe of this City was unfortunately drowned in the Long Reach, having been knocked overboard from a small boat.

Halifax, August, 18.

The Transports *Vibilia* and *Princess Royal*, which have arrived here from Liverpool since our last, brought a part of His Majesty's 96th Regiment.

His Excellency Major-General Sir **HOWARD DOUGLAS**, Bart. with his Family and Suite, embarked on Monday afternoon last on board of His Majesty's Ship *Samarang*—which vessel sailed for St. John, N. B. this morning.

We have great pleasure in announcing the safe arrival of His Excellency the Earl, and Her Ladyship the Countess, of **DALHOUSIE**, in England.—They landed from His Majesty's Ship *Atthoil* at Portsmouth, on the 5th July.

The 81st Regiment, we are happy to learn, is to be continued in this Garrison.—It is in a high state of discipline, and its departure would have been greatly regretted by the community. A small detachment however, will shortly embark on board the *Vibilia* Transport, for St. John's Newfoundland, where, we understand it will remain until the next spring, when it will be relieved, and return to Halifax.

The *Zephyr* brought London Papers to 17th July.

The King of Portugal it appears has applied to the British Government for a Military Force to protect him against the factious party which still exists in that Country; and we think it highly probable that some assistance will be afforded him.
