The English Mail for August, arrived at the Post-Office on Sunday—London dates are to the 14th.

We observe with sincere satisfaction the increase of a religious feeling expressed by the remote inhabitants of the river Saint John. The following Petition was handed us with a request that it might appear in our Columns:—

To His Excellency Sir Howard Douglas, Baronet, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New-Brunswick, &c. &c. &c.

THE Petition of the Inhabitants, Settlers, and Land Proprietors, in the Parish of Kent, York County, in the said Province.

Humbly sheweth—

That they feel much the want of an Established Church.

That in the whole Parish there is not a place of Public Worship; and consequently no Clergyman.

That the Parish is in length 60 miles, and contains 1002 Inhabitants, Men, Women, and Children, besides the Indians.

That the soil being very fertile, and possessing many natural advantages, and in addition to these blessings the Families are in general healthy, giving energy and vigor to their agricultural exertions, by which only they hope to grow into easy circumstances.

They look with a firm hope to a furtherance of an improvement to their condition, by an opportunity of attending to their Religious and Moral duties.

They therefore pray your Excellency, for such aid as in your wisdom you may deem meet; from such public fund as may be at your Excellency's command.

And they further pray, that steps may be taken preparatory to the inducting a professional Gentleman of your Excellency's choice; and as in duty bound will ever pray.

Capt. Shand has politely favored us with the following extract from his Log-Book:

"The Thalia sailed from the Downs Aug. 6—from Weymouth the 13th, and passed the Lizard on the 18th. On the 2d fell in with a British Frigate, was informed that all differences with the Dey of Algiers had been adjusted upon our own terms, without firing a shot. Sept. 11—Spoke, American brig Lapwing, from Smyrna, bound to Boston, was informed of the capture of Ipsara by the Turkish Fleet, and of the indiscriminate massacre of the Inhabitants—of the subsequent departure of the principal part of the Turkish squadron, and the arrival of the Greek Fleet, the recapture of Ipsara, the destruction of about twenty Turkish armed Vessels, and the shipment of all the Military and Naval Stores from the place, which were conveyed to Hydra."
