**IMPORTANT CHANGES.**

By the last arrival information has reached us through a private channel, that His Majesty's Government have resolved to disunite the Civil and Military Government of India; as also that of the North American Provinces. It is added that His Excellency the Earl of Dalhousie is selected for the highly honorable and important station of Commander in Chief in India, and that the Hon. Sir Francis Burton, now Lieut-Governor of Lower Canada, is to be placed at the head of the Civil Government of that part of His Majesty's dominions.—*Albion, June 5.*

From the many enquiries that have been made of us, respecting the rumour which was mentioned in our last, relative to the appointment of His Excellency the Earl of Dalhousie to the command of the forces in India, we are induced to be a little more explicit. We understood the intention of His Majesty's Government to be, to separate the civil and military commands, both in India and North America, permanently; and that Lord Dalhousie had been thought of for the military command in the former, and the Hon. Sir Francis Barton for the civil, in the latter. The information was brought by a British officer of rank, who arrived in one of the late Packets, and who stated that he had received it from such authority in London, as to enable him to speak of it as a matter of positive certainty.

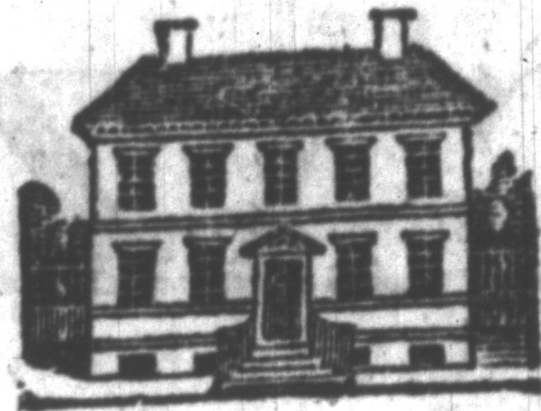
