The House of Assembly of Upper Canada, has complained of the smuggling of Teas and India Goods from the United States, and resolved to apply to the British Government, for leave to import directly from Canton and India to Quebec, or through the United States...

The Legislature of Lower Canada has before it a resolution for giving a Service of Plate (to cost £5000) to the Family of Sir George Prevost, Governor of that Province in the late war; but who has been dead for some time.

A monument is erecting on the field of Waterloo, to commemorate the battle fought there in 1815. It will consist of a lion 20 feet long and 18 feet high, placed upon a hillcock 150 feet high.

The King of Spain has, by a Decree, signed by the Royal hand, announced, his intention to have erected in Madrid, a magnificent monument to the revered memory of his brother, and cousin the august Duke de Angouleme and his valiant army.

It was reported in London on the 10th Nov. that several Regiments were under orders for embarkation.

Official returns from the Turkish Custom House at Scio, report FORTY ONE THOUSAND WOMEN AND CHILDREN; to have been sold as slaves, and to have paid auction duties at that office, in the month of May and June, 1823.

The fact of the number of slaves is given on the authority of the French Historical Annuaire for 1822, a very authentic and respectable work—of which the chapters on Greece appear to be drawn up from material transmitted by the French Consul.—N. Y. paper.
