On the 18th May, in front of the Lagoon of Terminus the English Ship Shannon was taken possession of, and all the Crew murdered.

Robinson and Wedderburn, are of the very first description, and with any assemblage of Troops would be remarked, as well for their complete style of equipment as for their training. The three Companies of Sea Fencibles under the command of Capt. Eagles, Crookshanks, and Leavitt, are very deserving of sharing in all the approbation which His Excellency has already bestowed on the Companies of Artillery.

The whole were ably commanded by Major Drury of the 1st Battalion, and to him, his Battalion, and to all the Officers and Troops present, His Excellency desires to express his approbation.
