[Here follows the Proclamation of His Hon. DANIEL MOLLEY HAMILTON, announcing his having assumed the Government of Sierra Leone, and its Dependencies, &c. &c. &c.]

GENERAL ORDER.

Head Quarters, Sierra Leone, April 16, 1824.

1. It is with sentiments of the deepest and most sincere regret, Lieutenant-Colonel SUTHERLAND announces to the Troops serving on the Windward Coast, that he has this day received a dispatch from Cape Coast Castle, reporting that His Excellency Brigadier-General Sir CHARLES MAC CARTHY, Governor and Commander of the Forces, was killed in a severe engagement with an Ashantee Force of greatly superior numerical strength, on the 21st of January last.

2. The Lieutenant Colonel wants words to express his grief on this most melancholy occasion or his sense of the great loss to the command, which is likely to result from His Excellency's death at this particular crisis—and, indeed, feels that any attempt, on his part, to eulogize the public services (meritorious as they undoubtedly were) of his late immediate Commander, would not only be supererogatory, but presumptuous. He will, however, take the liberty to record, that as Sir CHARLES'S life was humanely occupied in constantly devising and executing measures to ameliorate and civilize the condition of the wretched natives of Africa, so it was bravely, honorably and consistently, although unfortunately, sacrificed in open warfare, in opposing barbarian violence, and unprovoked aggression.

3. The flag flying at the ramparts of Fort Thornton will be but half hoisted during the whole of the day to-morrow, and minute guns equal in number to the age (65 years) of the late Commander of the Forces, will be fired from the Batteries in the course of that day. And all Officers in the command are requested to go in mourning (by wearing black crape on the left arm) for two months from this date, as a sincere, though small, tribute of respect to his memory.

4. The duties of Commander of the Forces having devolved on Lieutenant-Colonel SUTHERLAND, from 21st January last, in consequence of the afflicting event above specified, the same is notified to the Troops serving on the Coast, and all reports, &c. are to be made to him accordingly.
