discovered about a half mile of the wreck among whom were recognized Donald M'Kay, Esq. Mr. Forbes, (merchant of Mirimichi) and Captain M'Alpine, who were lying together. It would appear that they must have perished from the severity of the weather, as some provisions were found. The passengers who left Three Rivers in the Jessie, Captain M'Alpine, were Donald M'Kay Esq. Mr. Forbers, Mr. John Lowe, Mrs. Williams, wife of Mr. John Williams, and two of her family. The loss of each individual is sincerely to be deplored, but the blank which Mr. M'Kay leaves will be severely felt by every person in this Island, and indeed all who had the happiness of knowing him.

NEW-YORK, JUNE 22. BRAZIL. By the arrival of the Spartan at Alexandria, we have advices that on the 25th of last March, the Brazillian Constitution was sworn that Rio de Janerio, by the Emperor and heads of Government Departments.

In consequence of this act, the Brazillian Charge d'Affairs in the U. States, says the National Intelligencer, has received orders, we understand, to make oath to that instrument before a public Magistrate of this City, and afterwards to receive the oath of every Barzillian citizen resident in the U. S. to record the same, and to send to the Secretary of State, at Rio Janeiro, a copy duly authenticated.

WASHINGTON, JUNE 19. We understand that orders have been issued by the Navy Department to equip the U. S. ship of the line North Carolina for immediate service, and that she will bear the Pendant of Commodore John Rogers.
