As far as we are informed, the present prospect of crops, particularly our staple production *Wheat*, is very promising generally throughout this province. The weather of late has been favourable. To our industrious farmers this is an interesting season of the year. We wish them success in securing harvest, and a good market for their surplus produce.

The ship *BENJAMIN RUSH* lately arrived at Philadelphia from Carton with the following cargo:

Young hyson tea, 1,282 chests, 186 half do. 200 10 catty boxes, 308 5 catty boxes—Hyson Tea, 569 chests, 500 catty boxes; 11 boxes chulau, 25 boxes canister—Hyson skin Tea, 1,501 chests, 58 half chests. Souchong do. 1,212 chests, 284 half chests, 47 boxes 10 boxes padre—Souchong do. 110 chests, 120 half chests—Imperial do. 229 20 catty boxes, 656 10 catty do. 113 5 catty do. Gunpowder do. 25 boxes canister—Cassia 5 600 packages—Silks 295 cases—nankeens 100 boxes.

Were we in the full enjoyment of a free trade, many ships thus laden would annually visit the Port of Quebec, and the inhabitants of Canada could be supplied with Teas &c. at less than one half the prices now paid. Add to this the advantages which would result from our commerce with the people on the western frontier of the U. States, the greater part of whom might be induced to purchase their supplies of China and India goods in these Provinces.—*U. C. Herald.*

Important Seizures.—The Guardians of the Provincial Revenue in this district, have not only been active, but successful, during the last week.
