## HOUSE OF COMMONS,

SERENSES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF

Mr. Hume moved for Returns of the Salary, Allowance, &c. of the Governor of Newfoundland, the expenses of that Colony, the Receipt of Customs there, &c. — Ordered.

FEBRUARY 6.

Mr. Hume gave notice, that on the 9th March, he should submit to the House a motion on the subject of the property of the Irish Church Establishment, with the purpose of effecting its reduction. Seeing the Right Hon. Secretary (Mr. Canning) in his place, he begged to ask when he intended to introduce the long promised reduction of the Consular Appointments of the Coun-

Mr. Secretary Canning said that as to the "long promised reduction," it was not promised by him. He believed, however, that something satisfactory would soon be laid before the House on this subject; in the mean time he would inform the Hon. Member, that most of the salaries had been reduced.

Mr. Hume said, that he did not allude so much to the amount of the salaries, as to the principle on which the per centage was collected, which he wished to be altered.

Nugent wished to learn fr

Lord Nugent wished to learn from the Right Hon. Secretary, whether he had any objection to produce certain papers which would tend to enlighten the House on the subject of our relations with Spain. He wished to know if it were his intention to lay before the House (or if he would assent to a motion for the purpose,) copies of the instructions given to Sir W. A'Court, between the period of the French troops entering Spain, and the evacuation of Cadiz; and likewise copies of all communications during the same period, from the Spanish Covernment and Sir W. A'Court. If the Right Hon. Secretary would produce, or consent to the production of these papers, he (Lord Nugent,) would postpone his intention of moving for them.

Mr. Secretary Canning.—I have no intention to lay such papers before the House. Whether I shall or shall not oppose the Noble Lord's motion, depends entirely upon

the case he makes out.

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Lord Nugent said he should give notice of a motion for some early day, upon the conduct of His Majesty's Ministers relating to the war in Spain, how far they had kept their professions of neutrality.

The Chancellor of the Exchequer moved that a Supply be granted to His Majesty.

Mr. Hume, on the Speaker's putting the question, expressed a hope that no motion for a supply would be made until the Estimates were laid before the House.

Mr. Speaker observed that the motion was one of the rules of the House to vote Supplies generally to His Majesty.

Sir J. Wrottesley said that he hoped the Right Hop. the Chancellor of the Exchequer would explain what measures of hnance he meant to adopt in reference to the arrangements alluded to in His Majesty's Speech. - This explanation was necessary, as before the financial statement various specularions would be going on in the mean time. Some who might by some means be acquainted with the measures to be pursued would take advantage of that knowledge to the ruin of others, who had not possessed the same information. He trusted, therefore, that the Right Hon. Gentleman would fix an early day for the convenience of all Hon. Menibers.

The Chancellor of the Exchequer said that his intention was to inform the House of the measures he would pursue. The formal mode of doing so, was in a Committee of Ways and Means, which he would fix for Monday, the 23d inst.

The motion was then agreed to, and it was ordered that the House do on Monday next resolved itself into a Committee to consider of said Supply.

FEBRUARY 17.

The Navy Estimates were voted for 29,000 seamen and marines, being an increase of 4000 on last year's estimate.

In the dabate on the subject, Mr. Canning said, there never was a period in which the country might with greater certainty,

"It must be clearly seen that there never was a period in which there was so much agitation, and it was necessary, not only that we should be ourselves satisfied, that the conviction should prevail in all parts of the world, that the nation was prepared to maintain its rights."—The additional force required was necessary to raise the important stations in the Mediterranean, West-Indies and South-America, to a respectable peace establishment.

Lord Nugent, from the Opposition Benches, moved for the production of the instructions, &c. given to Sir W. A'Court, the British Minister to Spain, relative to the mediation of Great-Britain. Mr. Canning opposed the motion. Sir William, he said, was forbidden to put himself into a blockaded Port. An amendment to the motion, highly complimentary of the conduct of Ministers, was made, put, and carried, 171 to 30.

We are happy to announce that the King is almost recovered from his late attack of Gout. The answer to inquiries at the Palace yesterday, and up to the latest hour last night was---" His Majesty still continues better."
