"The most complete union prevails throughout all Greece A commission of eight members has been ordered to present to the Government, in eight days, a plan for the organization of a corps of 10,000 or 1 2,000 regular troops. Odysseus has sursendered himself to the Government. "It is said that General Roche has been
