It is not, perhaps, generally known, that by the Act 4 George IV. c. 41. every ship or vessel using the sea must take out a fresh register at the Custom-House, at the port she belongs to, during the present year.

It is said Mr. Wilberforce is, in consequence of the declining state of his health, about to retire from Parliament, after sitting 45 years.

The rail-roads now projected, if carried into effect, would consume iron to the value of *Twenty-Eight Millions sterling!* The 111 miles of road planned, between Birmingham and Liverpool will require 60,000 tons of iron for the rails alone, at the cost of £840,000.

The Honourable Robert S. Dundas is appointed one of the Commissioners of the Navy Board, in the room of the late Honourable E. Bouverie.

The number of vessels (British and Foreign) entered inwards from Foreign Ports, in the following years, was—In 1700, 4,385—1750, 1,682—1790, 3,415—1794, 3,663—1824, 5,116.

The coronation of the King of France is said to be postponed to the 25th June, as the preparations could not be completed by the time first proposed.

The following statement of losses, &c. is extracted from Lloyd's List of Nov. and Dec. last, and affords little encouragement for marine insurances at the present reduced rate of premiums—viz. 14 vessels foundered; 3 upset; 116 totally wrecked; 113 driven on shore, but many of them got off; 14 abandoned; 7 missing, and supposed to be lost; 191 put into port, dismantled, leaky, damaged, or with loss of anchors and cables, &c.—Total, 438.

The office of Secretary to the General Society, will for the present, be executed by GEORGE FREDERICK STREET, Esquire, of Fredericton, who will receive and answer all communications, and conduct

the general detail of the business of the Society.

A Scale for the encouragement of competition in the raising of Grains, Seeds, and Root Vegetables, and also for the improving of the breed of Horses, Horned Cattle, Sheep and Pigs, by granting of Prizes, is preparing, which will shortly be published.

The Central Board are also endeavoring to effect such an arrangement in respect to newly imported Emigrants from the Mother Country, as will secure to that numerous class of our fellow subjects, immediate employ and protection, on their arrival amongst us, and to the Farmer a supply of Labour at a rate, that will afford to the Labourer a profitable reward, and yet be within the means of his Employer to pay.

HALIFAX, MAY 11.

The schr. Shamrock, from Parsborough to Passamaquoddy, was lost in a heavy gale on the night of the 20th ult. within a few miles of Eastport.—The crew unfortunately all perished.

The Aurora left the Thames on the 17th April—on the 22d, off Falmouth, was boarded by a Pilot belonging to that place, who informed that the Packer for Halifax had sailed on the preceding Sunday, and that the Rinaldo, packer, from hence, had arrived at Falmouth on the 21st ult.

The Aurora brought London Papers to the 16 ult. with the loan of which we have been politely favored;—Their contents are not very interesting. Parliament had resumed its sitting.

The Atlantic Steam Navigation Bill was read a second time, in the House of Commons, on the 14th ult.

The Colonial Intercourse Bill was read a second time, in the House of Commons, on the 15th ult. and ordered to be committed to a Committee of the whole House.

A Society, bearing the designation of the British North American Ship Building Company, has been formed in England.—Capital, £500,000.

Lieut. General Sir William Clinton, G. C. B. has been appointed Lt. General of the Ordnance.

Royal Staff Corps.—Gent. Cadet, Philip Despard, from the Royal Military College, to be 2d Lieut.

The Rev. Dr. INGLIS was consecrated, as Bishop of this Diocese, on Sunday, the 27th March, being Palm Sunday. When the Aurora sailed it was uncertain at what time His Lordship would leave London.

The Proposals of the Halifax and Quebec Steam Company, have been received by the Aurora. We understand that Andrew Belcher and Samuel Cunard, Esquires, have been appointed Agents.—F. Press.
