

Smith, E.qr's. Yard Middie River, and yesterday, from the Building Yard of Mr. George Campbell, the fine Brig Nancy, of 330 Tons-all these Vessels went off in fine style, and without the e-st accident ; they are all copper fastened, and by judges are reckaned crack Ships.

" On Wednesday, the 5th inst. (O. r.) at 5 o'clock, A. M lat. 46 40 north, long. 58 30 west, the wind blowing hard fr m the S. S. W. hazy and very dark, under close reefed topsails running at the rate of $8\frac{1}{2}$ knots an hour a Vessel hove in sight; every exertion made to prevent us rinning on board. of her, but in vain. We struck her on the latboard bow with our starboard bows which knocked it in, she almost immediate. ly sunk ; and it was with difficulty, the crew, 15 in number, were saved. She proved to be the Brig Friends, of North Shields, John Ridley, Master, from Quetec, bound to Chipstow, Timber laden, Next day spoke the Brig Antoral bound o Southampton, put the Master, Maie, and three Boys, of the Friends on board."

The Angeline injured her bowsprin, and was considerably damaged by the shock.

Extract of a Letter from Richibucto, dated Oct. 19: 1825.

" The late destructive and awful fire at Miramichi, will prevent, in a great measure, the Lumberers here from gaiting out much Timber the ensuing Winter, as they depended chiefly upon Miramichi for their supplies of Provisions, &c.
