The King vs. Richard Cross, Esq.
FOR MURDER.

On Tuesday last, the Grand Jury presented a Bill of Indictment to the Court, charging the Prisoner with having murdered Edward Shey on the morning of the 26 Dec. and yesterday was the day assigned for the trial.

About Ten o'clock, their Honors Mr. Justice Halliburton and Mr. Justice Stewart took their Seats on the Bench, when the Prisoner was placed at the Bar, and the Prosecution opened by a most impressive address and the Attorney General. A great number of witnesses were subsequently examined, the Prisoner was heard in his defence, the whole evidence forcibly recapitulated by His Honor Mr. Justice Stewart, and, after a short consultation of the Jury, the Prisoner was fully acquitted.

During the Trial Mr. Cross conducted himself with great dignity and propriety; and the Verdict appeared to afford high satisfaction to the immense crowd of Persons who thronged the Court-House.

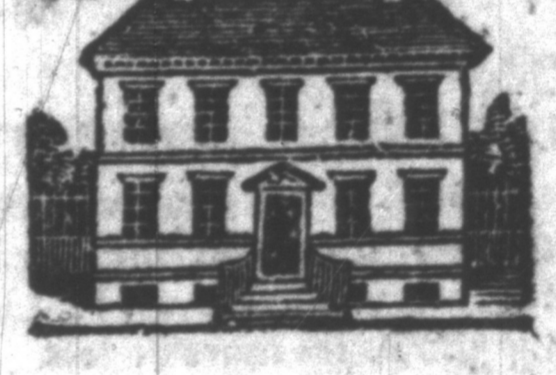
