HIS EXCELLENCY and Suite left Saint John one Tuesday the 13th instant, and dept that night at CRAIG'S Next morning it being announced at St. George, that His Excellency was on the Saint john Road, and approaching the village, the Magistrates and Militia Officers of the Parish, met His Excellency two miles from the Lower Falls, and escortes him to the Settlement.
