A PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS His Majesty hath been pleased, with the advice of His Privy Council, to disallow two Acts passed in this Province, the one initialed " An Act to encourage the Commerce of " the Province by granting Bouncies on the " exportation of certain articles;" the other " An Act to amend an Act intituled an "Act to provide for and maintain an Arm-" ed Cutter for the protection of the Reve-"nue of the Province;" and by an order of His Majesty in Council to declare the said Acts to be void and of none effect; which Royal disallowance has been duly signified to me by one of His Majesty's principal Secretaries of State: I have thought he to publish this Proclamation, that all persons whom it may concern, may be duly notified of the premises, and govern themselves accordingly.

GIVEN under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty-fifth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty five, and in the Sixth year of His Majesty's Reign.
