AT a meeting of a number of the principal Inhabitants of the County of York, on Saturday the 18th day of June 1825, at the Province Hall in Fredericton, assembled in pursuance of a notice given to take into consideration the establishment of a County Agricultural and Emigrant Society.

The ATTORNEY GENERAL was called to the Chair; when the meeting came to the following Resolutions.

1st. That a Society auxiliary to the Provincial Society be formed, to be called "The York Agricultural and Emigrant Society."

2d. That the following be established as the Rules and Regulations of this Society:

1st. An annual Subscription of 10s. (to be paid in advance) or a donation of £8 shall constitute a permanent member.

2d. That the Officers of this Society shall consist of a President, a Vice President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and twenty other persons (two of whom shall be from each Parish in the County,) being Members of the Society, all of whom shall be elected annually at the general meeting, and shall form a Committee to carry on the details of the Society.

3d. Five Members of the Committee shall be a Quorum for the dispatch of business.

4th. There shall be an annual meeting of the members of the Society, and quarterly meetings of the Committee. The annual meeting to be held on the second Tuesday in January at the County Court House in Fredericton, and the quarterly meetings of the Committee on the first Tuesdays in January, April, July and October at the same place.

5th. Any person refusing or neglecting to pay his Subscription previous to, or at the general meeting, shall cease to be a member till all his subscription arrears be paid.

6th. The particular object of any donation which may be made to the Society shall be strictly attended to.

7th. No money shall be appropriated but at the general meeting of the Society or quarterly meetings of the Committee.

8th. A special meeting of the Committee may be assembled upon the application in writing to the President, or in his absence to the Vice President, of any three Members of the Committee, stating the object of such meeting, and upon giving ten days notice in the Royal Gazette.

9th. The Premiums to be given shall be awarded by three judges who shall be appointed by the Committee at any quarterly meeting from among the members holding no office in the Society. The time and place of Cattle Shows and other Agricul-

tural exhibitions, to be appointed by the Committee at the same time, and public notice thereof, given by the Secretary.

10th. A report of the proceedings of the Society, and also the Treasurer's accounts shall be given at the annual meeting. The Treasurer's accounts to be previously audited by the Committee.

11th. This Society shall act in concert and correspond with the Central Committee of the Provincial Society, agreeably to the general Rules of that Society.

12th. Implements of Husbandry and Seeds furnished to Members of the Society shall be at a price not exceeding prime cost and charges.

13th. The Secretary shall be the corresponding officer of the Society under the direction of the Committee.

14th. The Secretary shall receive such compensation as the Society at their annual meeting may determine.

15th. Any Member may propose a new rule at the annual meeting, the same having been first proposed and approved at a quarterly meeting, and if approved at the general meeting the same shall be added to the Regulations.

16th. The Secretary shall keep a Book with the Register of Farms to be leased or sold—of Persons wanting Tenants or Servants, and of Tenants or Servants wanting Farms or places, and it shall be the duty not only of the Committee but of all the Members, to furnish the Secretary, and also Emigrants with information on these subjects whenever they may have an opportunity.

Which were approved of by the meeting.
