It is melancholy to hear of the depredations committed upon property of all descriptions at the late distressing fire in this Town, even after the owners had risked their lives, in saving it from the flames, and it is much to be regretted that an immediate and strict search was not made in every suspected quarter. Clothes, Beds, Blankets, Household Furniture, and goods of all kinds, were pilaged from the unfortunate sufferers, and we sincerely hope the villains will yet be detected and punished with the severity such inhumane conduct deserves, for no punishment could be too severe for the wretch who would steal under such circumstances. Some we understand were seen, amongst whom, to their utter shame be it spoken, were women; but in the hurry and confusion they unfortunately escaped. When occurrences of this nature take place in large and populous Towns, that are known to be effected with abandoned thieves, precautions are taken accordingly, but here not suspecting any thing of the kind, it was deemed unnecessary; but we trust such a lesson has been taught us that we shall for the future, look a little closer into the organization of our Police. It is notorious, that many who were compelled to remove their property from their houses, but who eventually escaped the flames, have lost more than some who were burnt out of house, and home. Several Boatmen and Carriers, were observed to cross the river, during the fire, and a group that left Fredericton on the Monday after was met by the Steam Boat, on Saturday near St. John, with men, women, and children on board, and the deck loaded with luggage.

The dreadful visitation Miramichi has experienced (as will be seen in our preceding columns), is such, surely as no land ever before underwent, and when we look at the heart rending account, our calamity here sinks into nothing.

CRUELTY TO ANIMALS.

A species of cruelty we are sorry to observe is practiced in our streets, which loudly calls for the interference of the Magistrate, that of putting horses to draw weights beyond their strength, either for amusement or for wages; and it is a pity some other employment could not be found, or some punishment inflicted upon those Truckmen who frequently practice it to the injury and ruin of the horse itself, and to the annoyance of all who have any feeling for that noble and useful animal—or that they should be suffered to lay the tax upon the publick they do, by which they are enabled to wantonly to idle away their time.

His Excellency Sir Howard, and Lady Douglas, Captain Douglas, and the Miss Douglas's honored the School in the Parish of Douglas with their presence, and after an examination, appeared pleased with the proficiency of the Scholars. His Excellency's condescending goodness must be highly gratifying to the Inhabitants, and his active attention to the interest of every part of the Province must be duly appreciated by all ranks of Society. At the same time His Excellency was most graciously pleased to make a donation of fifty pounds for the completion of the new Church in the Parish.
