#### WEST INDIES' CLERGY ESTABLISHMENT.

1. "That his Majesty be enabled to grant, out of the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the yearly Salaries hereinafter mentioned, to the Bishop, deacons, Ministers, and Catechists, of the Established Church of England and Ireland, appointed by his Majesty to serve in the Dioceses of Jamaica, and Barbadoes and the Leeward Islands, respectively, that is to say:

To the Lord Bishop of Jamaica	£4,000
To the Archdeacon of Jamaica	2,000
To each of the seven Ministers in that Diocese	300
To the Lord Bishop of Barbadoes, and to the Archdeacon of Antigua, each	2,000
To each of the thirteen Ministers in that Diocese	300
To each of the three Catechists	100

2. "That His Majesty be enabled to grant, out of the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, a yearly pension of 1,000*l.* to such of the Bishops of Jamaica and of Barbadoes and the Leeward Islands, as may retire from their Dioceses after a service of not less than ten years."
